Present Deliverance

TEXT.—The Lord Jesus Christ gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father.—Gal. 1:4.

The word "world" in our text is translated in the margin of the American Revision by the word "age." That translation helps us to understand better that it is not the evil "world" from which Christ delivers us, for the world itself is not evil; but from the "age" in which we live which is in the Scriptures characterized as evil. Present Salvation. The deliverance spoken of here is not from some future age, nor from wrath to come; but from "this present evil age." This corrects the current notion that salvation has altogether to do with the future. As often said, salvation has three tenses: the past, present and future. Past sins are forgiven through the Lord Jesus Christ, and assurance given that the believer "shall be saved from wrath through him."

But salvation does not stop with these two great facts of the past and future life of the believer; it also has to do with his present life. The text tells us that Christ purposed in giving himself for our sins to deliver us from this present evil age; so, for the believer in the Lord Jesus Christ there is present salvation, which was wrought out for him by Christ on the cross.

Reckoned Dead to Sin. In another epistle the writer of this one tells us that when Christ was crucified upon the cross, our old man—that is, our corrupt human nature—was crucified with Christ. This crucifixion with Christ, Paul says, is true of all believers in God's reckoning and he makes it clear that the first step in the believer's deliverance from this present evil age is for him to reckon himself as God does. "Likewise," in the same way, he says, "reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin" (Romans 6:11). Deliverance is not gained by denying the existence of the old nature in the believer, but by recognizing the fact of the old nature and then dealing with it as God asks us to, by reckoning it dead.

Reckoned Alive to God. But the apostle goes further. He says that we should reckon ourselves not only to be dead indeed unto sin, "but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord." This is the second step in present deliverance. Again we see that in the reckoning of God we were in Christ when he arose from the dead. This does not mean that like our Lord we are now actually on the resurrection side of the grave. It means that God counts us as if we were there and that now we are to reckon ourselves there through Jesus Christ our Lord. Well may it be asked: "How can this reckoning be done?" The answer is: "By faith." Reckoning these things true is an act of faith.

Yield to God. The third step in present deliverance might be called a double one: "Yield not," "Yield to" (Romans 6:13). The believer is not to yield to sin. This shows that, unlike his Lord, the believer is not without sin in him; the old corrupt nature can give way to sin. If the believer allows it; therefore, he is not to yield to the lust of the flesh, but rather to yield himself to God. The motive power for godly living is not the energy of the flesh but the power of the Spirit. How necessary, then, that the believer be filled with the Spirit! Again the question arises, how shall this be? And Paul answers: "The life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God." In other words he says that as he yields to Christ—and yielding, remember, is faith, not effort—it is trusting, not trying—Christ lives his own life in him.

This it is, that Christ saves us from this present evil age, making it possible for us to count ourselves dead unto sin, but alive unto God, and to yield ourselves to God as those that are alive from the dead that Christ may live in and through us his own blessed life.

The One Eternal Lesson. Life is not a holiday, but an education, and the one eternal lesson for us all is how better we can love. And Love is not a thing of enthusiastic emotion, either. The Apostle Paul, in a few words, gives what he called the analysis of Love. The elements of which it is composed have common names; they are virtues which we hear about every day; they are things which can be practiced by every one in any place in life. Patience, kindness, generosity, humility, courtesy, unselfishness, good temper, guilelessness, sincerity—these make up the supreme gift, the stature of the perfect man.

Text.—The Lord Jesus Christ gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father.—Gal. 1:4.

SHIP SALE IS STOPPED

Federal Judge Grants Temporary Restraining Order.

German Passenger Liners Cannot Be Disposed Of Until Final Disposition of Case, if Then.

Washington.—A temporary injunction against the sale of former German passenger liners by the United States shipping board has been granted by Justice Bailey of the District of Columbia court.

Hearings on the question of making the injunction permanent will be held later.

Justice Bailey declared that present laws showed no intention on the part of Congress to grant to the President or any of his appointees power to sell the ships.

The question, Justice Bailey said, was the sole one raised by the government in opposition to the application for the injunction.

Legislation which will give to the government permanent power to prevent transfer of American ships to foreign flags and appropriations to guarantee operators against loss if they keep vessels in trade routes allocated by the board, are expected to be sought in Congress within the next two weeks.

4 AGED WOMEN SUFFOCATED

Lose Lives When Fire Practically Destroys Institution.

Lynn, Mass.—Four aged women were suffocated when fire practically destroyed the home for aged women here. The dead are:

Mrs. Clara Walker, 30 years old; Miss Lydia K. White, 81 years old; Miss Martha Proctor, 92 years old; Miss Ellen A. Goway, 70 years old. Four of the inmates were removed to a hospital. They were suffering from exposure and the effects of smoke.

Dr. Anna Curtis, superintendent of the Fall River hospital, who was visiting at the home of Miss Bessie S. Kell, a nurse who discovered the blaze, aroused the inmates and helped the invalids from the building. In a last attempt to rescue one of the four women who were suffocated Mrs. Curtis was cut off from escape and jumped from a second story window.

6,000,000 ARE GIVEN WORK

Accomplishment of United States Employment Service.

Washington.—Employment has been found for more than 6,000,000 men and women by the United States employment service since its organization in January, 1918. Director General Denmore announced in a summary of the work of the bureau.

Standard Dress Given Approval. Columbus, Ohio.—Resolutions favoring the standardization of dress for business women in order to combat the high cost of living were adopted by the board of directors of the National Woman's Association of Commerce, in midwinter conferences here.

Mississippi Rejects Suffrage. Jackson, Miss.—The Mississippi Senate rejected the woman suffrage amendment to the federal constitution by a vote of 16 to 31. It previously was rejected by the House, 106 to 25.

Americans Are Menaced.

New York.—American hospitals, orphanages, refuge houses and other property in the Marash, Anitab and Malatia provinces of Asia Minor are menaced by the renewed assaults of the Turks on the Armenians, the Near East Relief has announced here. In Marash Americans are operating hospitals for adults and four orphan asylums, a rescue home for girls, industrial plants, the theological seminary of the Central Turkish mission and the Central Turkey Girls' college.

Colorado Community, in Existence More Than a Century, is Now to Have Institution.

The little Spanish town of San Luis, the county seat of Costilla county, Colo., in the lower end of the valley, will welcome its first bank when the State Bank of San Luis opens its doors for business. The majority of the residents of the vicinity are Spanish-speaking people of the old school, polished, courteous, energetic and prosperous. Some of the wealthiest men of the valley are to be found in the town and its close environs.
