COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS (Continued from Page 1.) County Treasurer's Office. One deputy, twelve months, at \$100 per month. One clerk, three months, at \$75 per month. Register of Deed's Office. One deputy, twelve months, at \$100 per month. One clerk for such time as in the judgment of Register of Deeds is necessary, at a monthly salary of \$75.00. County Judge's Office. One clerk, twelve months, at \$75 per month. Clerk of District Court Office. One deputy at the rate of \$3 per day for such days in the year 1921 as the Clerk of District Court may deem necessary. And it is further resolved that the County Auditor is authorized to issue warrants at the end of each month for the salaries of the deputies and clerks, as hereinbefore set forth upon the filing with him of verified claims as provided by law, excepting that the County Auditor shall not issue warrants in payment of the salaries of Deputy Clerk of Court and extra clerk in Register of Deed's office. Claims for these items to be passed upon by the Board of County Commissioners. Upon adoption of the foregoing resolution all Commissioners voted "aye," and none voted "no." At 6 o'clock P M Board adjourned until 9 o'clock tomorrow. Friday, January 14th, 1921. Board met at 9 o'clock A M, all members present. Until 6 o'clock P M Board was occupied thus, excepting one hour recess at noon. WHEREAS in the case of the State of North Dakota against Albert Dalzell, an agreement was presented by States Attorney Harold P. Thomson, wherein it was agreed that the said Albert Dalzell would pay the sum of \$1,250.00 to Edna Stavig, in full and complete satisfaction of all his liabilities for care and maintenance of one certain child, begotten of said Edna Stavig, AND WHEREAS said Edna Stavig, and her father, Enok Stavig, agreed to accept said sum for to indemnify the County of Pembina for all charges and maintenance of such child, AND WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners have considered such matter and are not satisfied with such agreement and indemnity to the County. NOW THEREFORE be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners that said Board do not approve of such agreement and conditions therein and do recommend that the sum of \$250 be paid over to said Edna Stavig, and that the sum of \$1,000 be deposited with the County Treasurer of Pembina County, North Dakota, to be paid out to said Edna Stavig, in sums not to exceed \$10 per month for the care and maintenance of said child, otherwise the settlement to be determined by the District Court. Upon adoption of the foregoing resolution all Commissioners voted "aye," and none voted "no." Abatement of a Portion of the 1920 Taxes in Cavalier Milling Property.
