Star route from Pembina to Hamilton has been ordered discontinued on Jan. 2nd, 1923. Patrons of this route will be supplied by rural route No. 2 from Hamilton, with a probable exchange of mail from Pembina to Hamilton and from Hamilton to Pembina by the carriers on rural route No. 2 from Hamilton and rural route No. 1 from Pembina. The department in most cases is replacing all Star routes with rural routes wherever possible. With the passing of the Star route from Pembina to Hamilton one of the oldest routes in the United States passes into discard, but this is a condition which is bound to come with progress and the people can be much better served from a rural route than from a Star, and service is what counts.
