Constitutional Questions Dominate Tuesday in Number of States, Some for Governor

Eight states, New York, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, Ohio and Mississippi, will hold elections next Tuesday, November 2.

With a few local exceptions, in fact, these constitutional questions will be the dominating issues on election day, including as they do such fundamental matters as women's suffrage, municipal home rule and the initiative and referendum.

While it has been held by some political writers that the referendum in New Jersey would be a landmark in the history of the suffrage movement, it is not so.

The importance of this test is indicated by the fact that in point of population, the states of New York, Pennsylvania and Massachusetts, which will vote on the referendum, contain nearly 50 per cent of the entire United States population.
