

NEWS IN BRIEF.

The South.

The Alabama Legislature met on November 15. On the 16th the Senate elected R. W. Cobb President. The House elected N. W. Clements Speaker. Both have served two terms in their respective houses. Governor Houston's message calls special attention to the State obligations, which hold a total of seventy cents on the dollar when he went into office, in 1874, and now amounts to ninety-two and a half cents.

General Events.

The Rev. P. Benson, of Richmond, Ind., was crushed to death while attempting, recently to get on a moving train, near Brighton Station, Cincinnati. His brother-in-law, Mr. E. O. Chase, in his efforts to save him, was struck, it is supposed, by the platform of a car, and was thrown violently into a cattle guard. The bones of his hip were crushed, and he sustained severe internal injuries that will probably prove fatal.

News of the Election.

New York, Nov. 13.—A special dispatch from Petersburg says that Mr. Jorgenson, Republican, has been elected Governor of North Carolina by a vote of 100,000 majority. New Orleans, Nov. 13.—The Democratic Committee has complete returns made up from duplicate lists of the Supervisors, showing Tilden's majority in the State to be 10,000. The returns show that the majority is to be nearly 9,000. The city is very quiet, and the polls are being kept open by the action of the Returning Board, which, by law, is required to meet ten days before the election.

General Events.

The British steamer City of Manchester, from Liverpool for Calcutta, has sunk off Akab. All hands except the captain and steward are supposed to be lost. Dispatches from the United States, September 18, state that a hurricane passed over that island on the 13th of that month. The bark Idalia Bernay, and the brig Veteran, were totally wrecked. The crew of the latter were saved, but that of the former, six in number, were drowned, including the Captain and his wife.

General Events.

The canvass of votes for Ohio shows on the first named Electors a Republican majority of 7,516. There are minor variations all through the State. Henry Clay, of R. L. Ruckey has but 1,324 votes, while all the other Electors have 1,327. In Hamilton he has from one to four more than the others, his vote being 23,869. Some of these may be merely errors in addition.

General Events.

The pardon of Wm. A. Avery lately arrived at St. Louis, and was forwarded to Jefferson City at once. The sentence of Constantine Maguire of six months in jail for complicity in the whisky frauds has expired, and he has been released. He was sentenced to pay a fine of five thousand dollars, but being a poor man he remained in jail one additional month to meet the requirements of the law in such cases.

General Events.

It is rumored that orders had been received from Washington to place the entire Brooklyn Navy Yard on a working foot. Commodore Nicholson declined to say anything in regard to the matter, but it is certain that very unusual movements are in progress at the yard, and that the rigging of Minnesota was furnished with ammunition, and fully equipped for sea.

General Events.

A mishap occurred on the Boston and Maine Railroad caused a freight train to run into cars standing on the track, killing the engineer, Charles Walker, and the fireman, and badly wrecking the engine and fifteen cars. North Carolina is reported Democratic by a large majority. Illinois cast a vote of 550,000, and gave the majority to Hayes.

General Events.

A great calamity occurred in Sacramento, on the night of November 18. During an entertainment at the Sacramento Opera-house, the floors gave way. Over one thousand persons were carried down among the crashing timbers. Seven were instantly killed, and over one hundred seriously injured.

General Events.

During a church entertainment, a few nights since, at Hill's Hall, Perryville, Madison County, N. Y., the north wall of the house gave way, precipitating a large number of women and children, twelve feet to the floor below. Two or three were fatally injured, and a number painfully bruised.

General Events.

Samuel McMillen and D. Haller, citizens of Columbus, Ohio, were killed on the railroad, near the Franklin road-house, in the eastern part of that city, by being run over by a freight train. Nine prisoners escaped from the Columbus (O.) jail, on the 18th. Four were recaptured. The leader of the gang was shot twice.

General Events.

Terrence Mullin alias Darrah, and Jack Hughes, alias Smith, have been arrested in Chicago, charged with the recent attempt to steal the remains of President Lincoln. It is said the proof against the prisoners is positive.

General Events.

The official majority for Hayes, in Michigan, is 25,000. Tilden's majority in Maryland is 19,700. His majority in Virginia is 44,244. The Vermont Legislature has passed a bill for filling vacancies in the Electoral College of that State.

General Events.

Just after midnight, lately, as the train on the Pan-handle Road left Columbus, Ohio, the dead body of a man was found lying on the track just outside the depot. The engine and train passed over his body, mutilating it terribly. A paper was found on the body, which was written in the name of the man, who was known as Edward Dowd. Concluded to kill myself. On the other side was a memorandum of work done. Deceased was about twenty-one years of age, and had on a suit and a top hat. It is thought that the man threw himself under the passing train.

Political.

The New York World has a dispatch from Montpelier, Vermont, suggesting a new complication in the election for President. The dispatch is as follows: Henry N. Solice, one of the Republican Presidential Electors-elect, is Postmaster of Bridgport, and, therefore, ineligible to the place to which he has been elected. This raises the question whether his Democratic opponent can not contest the election, and cast a vote for Tilden, thus deciding the National contest.

General Events.

Henry N. Solice, of Bridgport, Vermont, Republican Presidential Elector, against whom the question of eligibility has been raised, on the ground of his holding the office of Postmaster, in a late interview stated that his resignation as Postmaster is already in the hands of the Postmaster-General.

Foreign Items.

A Berlin dispatch reports that the entire Polish contingent of the Russian army has been sent out of the Polish provinces for service in the field. Russian garrisons remain in Warsaw and other large towns in Russian Poland. The treatment of the Polish reserves took place on the 14th and 15th inst, and was characterized by great rigor. At Warsaw the men were taken from their beds at night and escorted to the train.

General Events.

The following dispatch explains the Eastern situation up to the 19th November: A Reuter telegram from St. Petersburg says that in pursuance of the partial mobilization of the Russian army preparations are now being made for the mobilization of a sanitary corps. Movable hospitals are also being got ready. Committees of Walker, anti-Masonic candidate, 76, Hayes's plurality over Tilden 51,853. The Virginia City Enterprise says: A train of twenty camels, loaded with wood, came into town about eleven o'clock the other night. On account of their frightening horses and mules they are not allowed to enter the town during daylight.

A NICE OF MUNGO PARK, THE AFRICAN explorer, is living in destitute circumstances in Scotland. She is seventy-three years of age. A subscription paper is being raised for her benefit. It is to be hoped that the money will reach her before it comes necessary to use her foreign expenses.

KEY LARGO, Florida, but a few days since, was occupied by nearly twenty happy settlers, all having comfortable cottages, with fields of pineapple and other tropical fruits, but is now a scene of devastation and destruction. The most of their dwellings are gone with it, and their fields covered with salt water, their vessels high and dry on the rocks in woods, and most of them will be totally lost.

The German Government, in pursuance of its scheme of coin reform, has called in the old two-thaler pieces, which \$40,000,000 worth are said to be now in circulation, and will subsequently proceed to call in the one-thaler pieces, which \$271,365,000 worth are supposed to be circulating. In course of time a traveler in Germany will be able to know that he is spending, which, when the horrible old coinage was in circulation, he could not possibly.

Two players at bezique cutting for deal both cut ace; they tried again and both cut kings; they both cut again a third time, and here appeared two knaves.

A bezique pack consists of only thirty-two cards—all the twos, threes, fours and sixes being rejected, the improbability of such a coincidence is not so great as in a whist pack of fifty-two cards; nevertheless, the odds are calculated to be five hundred to one against the occurrence of this particular event.

The biennial report on the progress of Oregon gives the whole population of the State in 1875 as about 105,000, against 87,000 in 1870, but, though the growth of population is slow, a prodigious amount of wealth is produced. Nearly 600,000 acres of land are under cultivation, 3,200,000 bushels of wheat are raised, over 5,000,000 bushel of other grain, 1,853,000 pounds of wool, 1,555,000 pounds of butter, besides 4,800 barrels of salmon and 89,000 cases of canned salmon, the salmon fishery alone being valued at \$2,000,000 a year.

TERRE HAUTE Journal: On Sunday last a hen belonging to a Mr. Green, of the Washob Rolling Mills, was seen in a fight with a garter snake. Mr. Green and several men got near and watched them fight for fifteen or twenty minutes. The hen made a pick at the snake's head, when, like a flash, the snake made a dive into the hen's mouth and wiggled itself entirely down. The hen began running sideways, and finally died. On cutting her open, the snake was found to be alive yet. It was killed, and proved to be sixteen inches in length.

The French committee for promoting the consumption of horse-flesh has issued the following notice: "During the summer six months of the present year the butcher's establishments for the sale of horse-flesh were delivered for consumption 3,869 horses, 198 asses, and 15 mules, which yielded 747,610 kilos (2,2 pounds each) net of meat, without taking into account the liver, heart, tongue, etc., which are used like those of oxen." According to these figures, the consumption of this article of food is extending in the capital, and the same condition applies to the large towns in the provinces.

To young men who lay around waiting for something to turn up, we would recall the fact that most persons of note and real worth in this country have been those who fought their way to position through poverty, obscurity, disaster, and many adverse circumstances. Vanderbilt began as a boatman; Stewart as a petty retail merchant; Thomas Scott as at first a fireman and coal-heaver; Stephen Girard a cabin-boy; Horace Greeley went to New York an unappreciated young printer; Elias Howe nearly starved to perfect his sewing-machine; Anna Dickinson scrubbed door-steps early in life. We might extend the list indefinitely. Almost everybody "that is anybody" gain their crown by absolute grit and grace.

The first historical record made of the horse-shoe was during the reign of Leo VI, A. D. 900. It is probable the shoe had been previously in use, but it is not known how long. We read that Pompeus and Commodus shod their own horses with gold, but it is evident that this was some sort of gilt shoe drawn over the hoof, plated perhaps, with metal for the sole. Roman soldiers have been excavated at Pompeii, and the bones and ring bolts of horses found, but no traces of a horse-shoe. There is no evidence that a nail was driven into a horse's hoof previous to the fall of Greece and Rome.

The circumstances of doubt and dispute which overshadowed the fourth Presidential election in 1850 possess a decided interest pertinent to the present time. At that election, where the struggle lay between John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the voting was so close that it was not known who would be President for nearly three months, or from the 1st of December, 1850, to the 17th of February, 1851.
