STOP YOUR PROFANITY

Mayor will Enforce Several Ordinances.

ZACKMAN IS ARRESTED

Says That the Ladies Began Flirting With Him.

The "Lady Killer" is Given Lecture a Ten Dollar Fine and a Suspended Workhouse Sentence.

The mayor is planning a crusade against profanity on the streets of the city especially in the business district and will also take a whirl at the tobacco chewers who insist on flooding the sidewalks until at times they are in such a condition that women are almost compelled to walk in the gutters.

During the past few weeks the attention of the city's chief executive has been called to the nuisance in a very formidable manner. The element of the weather has through the sidewalks through the business part of the city with groups of men and boys of all classes. The conversation in these groups is not always all that might be desired yet ladies passing by on the sidewalks cannot help but overhear much of it. Dirty stories, the worst kind of language, is used and little regard paid to those who are in position to hear.

In the same groups are those who "chaw the weed" and spit the juice over the sidewalks creating small pools that make the gutters more desirable for walking than the proper places.

The nuisances have grown until they are becoming unbearable and the authorities are determined to have them stopped.

The police department and probably special officers will be enlisted by the mayor in arresting offenders of this class. A fine of \$1 will be assessed against all offenders. It is expected that much of the nuisance can be done away with if a few dozen of the many offenders are brought into court and fined.

Charged with insulting ladies, passing along South State street across from the Opera House and ladies residing in the vicinity, Ernest Zachman, of South State street, was arrested last night and placed in the city prison by Officer Chapman.

Ernest is a German about sixty years old. He is not overburdened with good looks but notwithstanding he imagines that he is a "lady-killer" and stationing himself near the Hotel Marion or the Opera House he does the mashing act. At times he becomes very insulting and several persons have threatened to give him a good sound horsewhipping.

Zachman had no excuses to offer in court except that the ladies flirted with him first before he said anything to them. He received a good talk from the mayor who advised him to get to work immediately and cut out his mashing stunt. The mayor fined the ladies' man \$10 and gave him a suspended workhouse sentence which will be enforced in case he is again reported.

During the past few months a great number of the persons brought into the mayor's court have been boys between the ages of ten and twenty years. Offenses of all class have been found against them. The authorities state that the past winter has been a record breaker in the number of juveniles in court with serious charges against them.

W. Davis, a sheep shearer hailing from Harpster, was arrested last night by Officer Chapman for drunkenness. He was fined \$5 by the mayor at the hearing this morning.
