PRESIDENT BONILLA PREPARING TO FIGHT

He Claims the Honduran Capital was Evacuated in Order to Save the City From Bombardment--Central American War Not Yet Over.

Puerto Barrios, Guatemala, April 6.—After the battle of Namarique, in which the forces of Honduras were defeated by the Nicaraguans, President Bonilla withdrew and occupied Amalpa, which place is fortified and defended by a strong force.

President Bonilla sent instructions from Amalpa, authorizing General Saturnin Meda to evacuate Tegucigalpa if he was unable to defend it and save the city from bombardment and looting. The evacuation followed.



DEED IS INVALID

Such are the Allegations in the Defense of Christian Science Case.

Concord, N. H., April 6.—The first legal step to meet the surprise sprung by the defendants in the Christian Science litigation, was taken this afternoon when counsel for the plaintiffs filed a supplemental bill in equity, attacking the validity of the trust deed, executed by Mrs. Eddy, March 6. This action caused almost as much surprise as the news of the trusteeship. The plaintiffs ask that the deed of trust be vacated, on the ground that the aged grantor is not competent to execute a supplementary bill and brands the creation of the trust as a further bit of conspiracy.
