CLEVER RUSE IS WORKED

Stranger Gets Away with Bicycle

MAYOR COMPLIMENTED

For Stand Taken on Baseball Question.

Several Over Enthusiastic Fourth of July Celebrations End in the Police Court Friday.

By working a new trick successfully an unknown man secured a fine new bicycle valued at fifty dollars and George W. Robertson is mourning the loss of the wheel.

Yesterday morning about ten o'clock Howard, the son of Mr. Robertson rode the bicycle down town to purchase some fireworks. He left it in front of the Leffler grocery on South Main street, going inside to purchase enough noise making contrivances to properly celebrate the day.

As he came out and prepared to mount the wheel a man approached him asking his name. The boy told the stranger his name and also his father's. "Why," said the man, "I know your father and all of your family well. I have an appointment to meet a man in the West End and must get there in five minutes. I will give you twenty-five cents to allow me to ride the wheel there and back and you will only have to wait about ten minutes."

The twenty-five cents sounded good to the lad so he agreed. The man handed him a dime, saying he would give him the other fifteen cents when he returned, and getting on the bicycle started west.

The youngster waited a while and when the bicycle was not returned within about half an hour he went in the grocery and bought more fireworks with the dime the stranger had given him. He then recommenced his vigil. Several hours passed and the bicycle was not returned. A thorough search of the city by the police failed to locate the stolen property and it is believed that the thief has left the city. The bicycle was a practically new "Ranger Special."

Ray Longshore, aged fifteen years was arrested by Chief of Police Cornwell and Officer Cusick this morning charged with stealing a number of bottles from Carl Ramroth. The lad had a wheelbarrow full of bottles which he had taken from Ramroth's barn on North State street. He was taking them to a junk dealer when taken into custody.

Longshore is the son of U. Longshore of Uneapher Avenue. The police have evidence that he and a number of other boys have made a practice of stealing bottles and selling them to junk dealers. It is probable that the other boys will be arrested tonight or tomorrow.

At his hearing Longshore admitted the charges against him. He was given a lecture by the mayor after which he was released upon promising the court to behave himself properly in the future.

The mayor received a call this morning from Mayor Charles Ritzler of Green Camp. Mr. Ritzler complimented the mayor on stand on the Sunday baseball question. He said that in past years the banks of the Scioto river from Green Camp to Prospect have been lined with people from Marion, who have caused no little disturbance and trouble. The various parties, firing the banks were well supplied with cases and kegs of beer and many disgraceful scenes were witnessed every Sunday.

Since the advent of Sunday baseball, Mr. Ritzler told the mayor, the revellers have been conspicuous by their absence and he believes that baseball has had the effect of lessening a greater evil.

P. Walters, a quarryman from Owens, acquired a jag some place south of Marion and was put off an interurban car in the West End last night because he wanted to whip everyone in the car. After he alighted from the car he mixed up with several men and was arrested by Officers Hostetter and Duncan. A charge of intoxication and disorderly conduct was placed against him.

In the mayor's court Walters was given a good lecture this morning and fined \$10 which he arranged to pay.

Paddy Malarkey, lately of Springfield, celebrated the Fourth

by getting full and causing a disturbance in the West End. He was arrested by Officer Cusick and was fined \$5 by the mayor this morning.

James Dougherty, a tramp, was patriotic enough to get drunk yesterday and Officer Frame escorted him to a cell in the city prison. James was shy of money so the mayor ordered him to leave the city.

Revival Services at Central Christian Church Creating Public Comment.

There were three confessions at the Central Christian church last night. The appeal of the gospel proved its power to reach the extremes in ages. One of the three that came forward was an old lady sixty-seven years old. She arose and was baptised the same hour of the night.

The revival is creating public comment, and it is predicted by the evangelists that their campaign here will prove to be one of the largest in point of converts that they have ever held. A vast plan of systematic personal work was launched yesterday afternoon, by which every non-Christian person and family in Marion will have received a personal invitation to accept Christ before the meetings close. Canvassers are out today in all sections of the city.

Extensive preparations are being perfected to hold a mass meeting for children next Sunday afternoon. The children of the Sunday School and the "Sunshine Chorus" are wearing tags which say "Tag your Memory."

There will be no evangelistic services at the church on Saturday. Instead, the chorus and a large company of the church members have chartered four street cars for a tour of the city. They will meet at the church at 7:30 o'clock and from there march to the Court House square, where they will board the cars. The company will make a tour of the entire system and will sing gospel hymns enroute.

The sermon by W. T. Brooks was one of the strongest that he has yet delivered. The man impresses his audience with his absolute sincerity and earnestness. ARTHUR TIMMONS SERIOUSLY INJURED

Fall From Tree at Webb Park.

Right Wrist Broken, Internal Injuries Sustained Which May Prove Fatal.

While watching the preliminary practice of the Marion-Mansfield ball game at Webb park Thursday afternoon, Arthur Timmons, aged 13 years, fell from a tree in which he was sitting. He crashed through the outer limbs of the tree, falling to the ground, a distance of 40 feet. His right wrist was broken and he sustained internal injuries which may prove fatal.

The limb on which the boy was sitting broke, causing his descent. Probably 25 other youngsters in the tree witnessed the accident.

Dr. James W. McMurray, Dr. S. H. Britton and Dr. H. L. Usher were summoned and made an examination of the lad. His condition was found to be serious and he was taken in the C. F. Hess ambulance to the Central Emergency hospital. Early in the evening he was conveyed to his home at No. 19 Cottage street.

SEWER UNEARTHED

Workmen Locate Drain Laid Probably 40 Years Ago.

In digging a sewer on South Main street in front of the Hess undertaking establishment, today, workmen unearthed one of the old plank drains which were laid probably 40 years ago. The drain was constructed of four planks arranged in a square and was apparently in good condition. It was abandoned several years ago.

This ancient sewer system, which has not been in use for a great many years, drained into a main sewer on Columbia street, then known as Canal street. All of the small drains were constructed of planks and were regarded as being the best to be had at the time they were placed in use.

A number of small drains are thought to be under the South Main street pavement still, but as far as is known none are in use.
