## QUARTERLY CONFERENCES

Held at Wesley and Epworth Churches.

## REPORTS ARE SUBMITTED

Showing Churches to be in Excellent Condition.

Both Congregations Have Asked Annual Conference to Return Pastors for Another Year.

An adjourned session of the last quarterly conference of Epworth M. E. church was held in the church parlors last evening. Practically all of the trustees and stewards were present and a very profitable session resulted.

The treasurer, John H. Clark, submitted his annual report which disclosed that the church is in better condition financially than ever before in its history. The report showed that almost \$6000 was collected for current expenses during the past year and that all bills paid leaving a reserve of \$150 in the treasury. All this has been accomplished without any extra collections or special solicitations.

During the past year the church has employed a special soprano soloist and the expenses in every way have been greater than ever before. The parsonage, which is nearly completed is practically all paid for and the church in every respect is in first class standing.

Rev. D. H. Bailey, the pastor, left today for Toledo, where he will attend the Central Ohio conference, which is in session there this week. At the last quarterly meeting several weeks ago, Rev. Bailey was unanimously asked to return to the pastorate of the local congregation.

Fearing that the conference might not grant the wish of the local board, a pulpit committee was appointed last night, whose duty it will be to accompany Rev. Bailey and ask for his return to the congregation. The committee is composed of Messrs. John H. Clark, John Waddell, Johnson Mooney, Philip Bauer and George Lawrence.

The congregation of Wesley M. E. church held its last quarterly meeting for the year, Monday evening, and closed up all business affairs. Reports were read showing that the past year has been most successful to the extent that it closes with all bills paid and \$1,000 applied on the church debt. The congregation is working hard to have the debt cleared within a few years and under the leadership of the present pastor, Rev. C. E. Rowley, all of the members are confident of reaching the desired end.

Rev. Mr. Rowley left this morning for Toledo, where he will attend the annual Central Ohio conference, the opening sessions of which will take place Wednesday, Thursday the lay delegates, Charles Pine and James Osborne, will go to Toledo.
