MURDER OR SUICIDE BUT

Police are Uncertain in the Hurford Case at Cleveland.

By United Press Wire. Cleveland, O., Sept. 14.—Police investigation today failed to throw light on the mystery surrounding the fatal wound of Basil B. Hurford, 27, on Cedar avenue, last night. Hurford, son of Alvah Hurford, Canton capitalist, is a graduate of Annapolis.

Hurford is dying at St. Luke's hospital from a three-inch stab wound in his neck. His wife, Mrs. Belle C. Hurford, who is suing him for divorce, was refused permission to see him. Police are searching for a girl about twenty, whom the wounded man called "Irene," and a second man. Both were with Hurford at the time of the stabbing. Hurford has refused to give police their names or any clew.

Police waved between the theories of attempted murder and suicide. The knife with which the wound was made has not been found. The girl called "Irene" told persons who rushed to Hurford's assistance that he had attempted suicide.
