to proceed with the improvement of Blaine avenue from Church street to Columbia street in accordance with a resolution for that purpose passed on the 24th day of October, 1910, by said Council and being known as Resolution No. 25; and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the Department of Public Service.

Section 2. That all claims for damages herefrom shall be judicially inquired into before the commencement of the proposed improvement, and the City Solicitor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth thereof, and the cost of intersections thereof, shall be assessed by the City Engineer upon all lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said improvement on Blaine avenue between Church street and Columbia street, and upon other land specially benefited by said improvement, as follows: Being a part of land No. 1 and numbered as 238 in the City of Marion, Ohio, and bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the northeast corner of said lot and extending south on a line parallel with the east line of said land No. 238, 130 feet to the north line of Columbia street; thence north on the south line of said land 400 feet to the piece of ground which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be especially benefited by said improvement, and the cost of issuing the same in anticipation of the collection of the assessments to be levied on said improvement, interest and all other necessary expenditures.

Section 4. That the assessments so levied shall be paid in ten annual installments with interest on deferred payments not to exceed six (6) per cent, per annum, payable semi-annually, provided that the owner of any property may, at his option, pay such assessments in full at any time after said assessment has been levied, with interest on the semi-annual interest due of said bonds next following the last payment.

Section 1. That it is hereby decided by the Council of the City of Marion, Ohio, three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring, to proceed with the improvement of Olney avenue from Columbia street to Bellefontaine avenue.

Section 2. That all claims for damages herefrom shall be judicially inquired into before the commencement of the proposed improvement, and the City Solicitor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth thereof, and the cost of intersections thereof, shall be assessed by the City Engineer upon all lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said improvement between Columbia street and Bellefontaine avenue which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be especially benefited by said improvement, and the cost of issuing the same in anticipation of the collection of the assessments to be levied on said improvement, interest and all other necessary expenditures.

Section 4. That the assessments so levied shall be paid in ten annual installments with interest on deferred payments not to exceed six (6) per cent, per annum, payable semi-annually, provided that the owner of any property may, at his option, pay such assessments in full at any time after said assessment has been levied, with interest on the semi-annual interest due of said bonds next following the last payment.

Section 5. Bonds or notes of the City of Marion, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by interest on deferred payments in an amount equal thereto.

Section 6. That the remainder of the entire cost of the proposed improvement, as herein provided, shall be paid by the issuance of bonds in manner provided by law.

Section 7. That the Director of Public Service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make and execute a contract for said improvement to the lowest and best bidder after advertisement according to law.

Section 8. That the grade of said sewer shall be determined by the City Engineer, and the general nature of the proposed improvement, with the grade thereof, and abutting plans, specifications and profiles therefor.
