





constructed last year at an expense of \$10,000, with all the modern improvements which overcome the objections to the old fashioned Calliope or so called Steam Piano. It has also La Fourches patent combination balance valves, which allow any ordinary piece of music to be executed with only a pressure of 60 pounds of steam, whereas to play the slowest music on any of those hitherto made would require a steam pressure of not less than 250 pounds to every square inch, endangering every one in its vicinity, and causing the explosion of at least two steamers on the Mississippi, shortly after they were first invented, the "Scotland" and "Music," destroying many lives, when they immediately fell into disuse. The Great Steam Organ of this Show has seven and one-half octaves, three banks of keys and seventy-eight stops, with diapason and tremolo attachments, which requires an experienced organist to manipulate, when the most ravishing music is produced.
