most practical and useful part of

grammar can be most easily taught

in the lower grades, before the pupil

is required to use the text-book. Al-

though this is the most difficult sub-

ject to teach in our Public schools,

our teachers have shown that it can

be taught well, and can be made

practical.

Based on the above satisfactory re-

cord, which shows that the teachers

have done better work as they have

had better opportunities, I should

mention the fact that nearly every

scholar in school received a prom-

otion card, notwithstanding that

there was much continued absence

during the winter term on account

of sickness, and the examinations

which promotions were based were

numerous and thorough.

It is with much pleasure that I

have called your attention to the

above pleasing record of faithful

work performed by both teachers

and scholars; but there is one point

more in which I almost indulge a

feeling of personal pride.

The moral standard of our schools

I think, is even higher than the in-

tellectual. The scholars manifest a

conscientiousness in their work,

which is most gratifying and but

seldom seen. They show a generos-

ity and good nature on the play-

ground which makes it a pleasure to

watch their sports. The Superinten-
