HUERTA WILLING TO STEP ASIDE

Would Go This Length to Reach Peaceful Settlement. SO INSTRUCTS HIS ENVOYS

Belief Growing in the National Capital That the Niagara Falls Conference Will Result Speedily in an Agreement For the Elimination of the Dictator From the Mexican Situation—Late Developments.

Washington, May 19.—The belief is growing in Washington that the Niagara Falls conference will result speedily in an agreement for the elimination of Huerta from the Mexican situation...

Word has also reached Washington from reliable quarters in Mexico City that Huerta has given his commissioners authority to go to this length in reaching a peaceful adjustment of the difficulties...

President Wilson told the American commissioners, Justice Lamar and Frederick Lehmann, who left today for the mediation conference at Niagara Falls, Ont., that the United States government regards the settlement of the Mexican problem in a definite form as a prerequisite to the withdrawal of the American forces from Vera Cruz...

Intimations came from the leaders of the Constitutionalist party in Mexico that no only was Huerta to be eliminated, but his entire party must be removed before they will consent to any peace arrangement that may be devised at Niagara Falls...

Intimations that have come from the three Huerta delegates since their visit to this country show that they realize Huerta's elimination is regarded as essential to a settlement and they know from the outset that unless they came prepared to deal with this phase of the problem their efforts would be fruitless...

AT NIAGARA FALLS

All in Readiness For the Mediation Conference. Niagara Falls, Ont., May 19.—All is in readiness for the meetings of the men who are about to try to find a solution to the Mexican tangles...

The Argentine envoy reached the Elifton hotel, without incident, but his arrival created considerable stir on both sides of the river. Dr. Naon spoke on many subjects, but carefully avoided any reference to the Mexican situation and the forthcoming conferences other than to express an extreme hopefulness for a successful outcome of the negotiations...

The Duke of Connaught, governor general of Canada, sent the following message to Ambassador Da Gama on his arrival here: "As governor general I welcome your arrival on Canadian soil and express my best wishes that your work to preserve peace may meet with speedy and lasting success."


