

THE JAPANESE EMBASSY.—The U. S. steam frigate Roanoke arrived at New York on the 9th, with the Japanese Embassy on board, but was immediately ordered to Norfolk, whence the Embassy go direct to Washington. The Express says:

The Japanese were informed of the change in the programme by their chief interpreter, Nam-on-rago-hatche-ro, and professed to be pleased with the directions of the Government, that they should be immediately conveyed to Washington. This course corresponds with the orders of the Tycoon, which was that they should at once present themselves to the President.—The appearance of our Japanese visitors was most agreeable and prepossessing. They were mostly dressed in loose blue coats and wide trousers, white stockings and leather slippers, and with uncovered heads. Their hair was drawn up in two long bands to the tops of their heads, and was there confined by a singular contrivance of wood or horn. In stature they were generally a little below the average of our own people, and in complexion somewhat darker, although a few exceptions showed that there are among the Japanese complexions as fair as those of our Caucasians. Their countenances were full of intelligence, and an expression of great amiability seemed to belong to all alike. Of the most eminent dignitaries, only stray glimpses were attainable, these gentlemen being secured in the acclusion of their state-rooms, chance opening doors of which revealed them undergoing the comforting process of shaving and having their feet washed. There are 71 Japanese on board the Roanoke, one of the original delegation having been taken ill at San Francisco, and left behind to be reconducted home.

ANOTHER CONVENTION.—From the City papers, we learn that another Convention will be held in this city on the 4th of June proxo.

An earthquake visited eastern Ohio a few days since, which is said to have been more serious than any preceding one of which there is any record. It lasted for thirty minutes, producing the most intense excitement, and striking terror to the hearts of all who happened within its range. At Cambridge, Barnesville, and other points, the citizens assembled together in the streets and prayed for a safe deliverance from the destined fate which seemed impending. The most singular feature of the event—long to be remembered by those who saw and felt it—was the falling of what is supposed to be meteoric stone, in various portions of that locality.—Four large stones, weighing from forty to sixty pounds each, fell on or near the track of the Central Ohio railroad, near Concord, burying themselves in the ground about two feet; while at Claysville, southeast of Cambridge, and other portions of the country, stones of the same quality, but in greater quantities, came down.

FOR EARL GREY AND THE TIMES. We commend the following to the notice of Earl Grey and the editor of the London Times. It is part of the report of proceedings in the Newfoundland Legislature and beats Congress, rather:

In the House on Friday night, the Colonial Secretary, Kent, and Attorney General Hogsett quarrelled. The Colonial Secretary called Her Majesty's Attorney General a puppy and a brat. The Speaker accused the Attorney General of being drunk. The Attorney General called the Speaker a liar. The scene was kept up till one o'clock Saturday morning.

The Sardinian Government continues its defensive military preparations. 82,000 swords have been ordered from abroad for the infantry and immense batteries of rifled cannon are in course of completion at Brescia. A number of Armstrong and Whitworth guns have been recently purchased for the armament of the coast and the defense of the arsenal of Spezia. Every possible exertion has been made to increase and strengthen the fleet, as the combined marine powers of Austria and Naples might do considerable mischief on the coast, before France could interfere, in case of a sudden outbreak.

The Democrats and the Constitutional Unionists in Detroit, both "burned powder" yesterday—the former to sustain the course of their delegates to Charleston—the latter in honor of the Baltimore nominee.
