

In an interview with H. M. Flagler published in the New York World he announced that work on the Key West extension of the Florida East Coast railroad will be stopped on January 1st next, and any parts of the work that are unfinished at that time must wait until the conditions in the money market become more favorable.

"I fear that conditions will become worse before they begin to get better," he said. "I have seen the present stringency coming for a long time. It was foreshadowed by the popular feeling against railroads and corporations, as reflected in the state and national legislatures. Accordingly I have taken precautions against it. Expenses on my road have been reduced, and the new construction work on the Key West extension has been put into such shape that by January 1st we can drop it just where it stands and not take it up again until the money market is in better shape.

"I know very little about conditions on the other railroads or in the New York money market. I have never been into a banking institution in New York on a matter of business, and I am really not a railroad man except for my little hobby down in Florida. I am proud of that. It has opened to settlement a stretch of three hundred miles of the finest country in the whole world. Thousands of people who went down there as poor as Lazarus have been enabled to become prosperous producing citizens.

"I have had a great deal of praise for what I have done down there. It is a most pleasant thing to have, but how much finer would be the feeling that one deserves the kind things that are said about him.

"One of the economies that has been put into effect on that road is the cutting off of a night train on one section where there were only two trains, one by day and the other by night. A peculiar result of this was to more than double the business done by the day train, so that not only were expenses reduced but revenues were actually increased."

It is possible that the election of October 1 may be contested in the courts. Initial possible steps in this direction were taken last night, when J. R. Saunders and H. H. Boyer, two of those aligned with the Prohibitionists in the recent campaign, appeared before the board of county commissioners and made the request that they be furnished with a copy of the polling lists of each precinct, and also be allowed to compare these lists with the registration books. The request was granted.—Pensacola Journal 9th.

NOTICE OF INCORPORATION.

The undersigned hereby give notice that on the 24th day of November, A. D. 1907, at nine o'clock a. m., or as soon thereafter as they can be heard, they will apply to the Honorable N. B. Broward, Governor of the State of Florida, in his office, in the Capital Building of said State, in the City of Tallahassee, for Letters Patent incorporating them, their associates and successors, into a body politic and corporate in deed and in law, under the name of "Panama City Publishing Company" under the following Charter and Articles of Incorporation, the original of which will be on file in the office of the Secretary of State of said State of Florida, at the City of Tallahassee, during the time required by law for the publication of this notice.

CHARTER OF THE PANAMA CITY PUBLISHING COMPANY.

The undersigned hereby agree to become associated together, and do hereby associate themselves together for the purpose of becoming a body politic and corporate under the laws of the State of Florida, the provisions of which are hereby accepted. The following Articles of Incorporation shall constitute and become its Charter upon the issuance of Letters Patent according to law.

1.

The name of this corporation shall be Panama City Publishing Company. Its principal office and place of business shall be in the Town of Panama City, Washington County, Florida. Branch offices may be established at such other places as may be selected by the Board of Directors.

2.

The general nature of the business of the corporation shall be to engage in business as proprietors and publishers of newspapers, journals, and magazines; to acquire, print, publish, conduct, or otherwise deal with any newspaper, magazine, books, or other publications; to carry on the business of newspaper and magazine proprietors and publishers; to carry on the business of job printers, lithographers, engravers, etchers, and advertising agents; to engage in business as stationers, engravers, book binders, book sellers, and paper dealers; to buy and own real estate, and sell the same whenever necessary for carrying on the business of the corporation; to do all things necessary and appertaining to the business, and to buy, use, and dispose of all property, both real and personal, incidental to carrying on the same.

3.

The amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be \$10,000 dollars, divided into 1,000 shares of the par value of \$10 dollars each; said capital stock shall be paid for in lawful money of the United States, or all or any part of said capital stock of said corporation, including the stock subscribed for by the incorporators, may be payable in, or issued, or used for the purchase of property, labor or services, at a just valuation thereof, to be used by the Board of Directors at a meeting to be called for that purpose.

4.

This corporation shall exist for a period of fifty (50) years, unless sooner dissolved according to law.

The business of this corporation shall be conducted by a Board of not less than three nor more than five Directors.

The Board of Directors shall select from themselves a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Said Board of Directors shall have authority to appoint all necessary agents of this corporation.

Annual meetings of the stockholders shall be held at the principal offices of the corporation on the 1st Tuesday after the 1st Monday in January of each year, at ten o'clock a. m., or as soon thereafter as practicable, at which the Board of Directors shall be duly elected by the stockholders.

The By-Laws for the government of this corporation shall be adopted at the first meeting of the stockholders, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

Until the officers elected at the first annual meeting shall have been first duly chosen by the stockholders, and qualified, the business of the said corporation shall be conducted by the following named persons and officers: G. M. West, President; W. E. Look, Vice-President; R. L. McKenzie, Secretary and Treasurer. Directors: R. L. McKenzie, A. Hogeboom, G. M. West.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability this corporation shall at any time subject itself to is \$20,000 dollars.
