NEW MEXICO PUBLIC REVENUES LAST YEAR TOTALED \$3,079,646

Auditor Is Mandamused to Build Hatchery—Pictures of Governors to Be Placed in Capitol.

Santa Fe, N. M., Jan. 20.—Territorial traveling auditor Charles V. Safford has completed the compilation of all the public revenues of New Mexico, for all purposes last year, and found it to be \$3,079,646, of which more than \$2,000,000 came from direct taxation, while the rest included \$135,000 from liquor licenses, \$30,000 from mercantile licenses, \$40,000 from bond issues, \$30,000 from forest reserves, this was on an assessment of \$56,000,000 and an estimated population of 400,000.

GIVES BOND TO BUILD RAILROAD

Line From Pecos to Balmorhea, Texas, Must Be Completed by June 1.

Pecos, Tex., Jan. 20.—W. L. Carville has signed a contract to construct a railroad from Pecos to Balmorhea and the Davis mountains and will begin work Wednesday. He gave \$100,000 bond to complete the road to Balmorhea June 1.

PACKING HOUSE FOR SWEETWATER

McSweeney Company to Install \$250,000 Plant at Once.

Sweetwater, Texas, Jan. 20.—The McSweeney Packing company of New Jersey, recently made a proposition to the Sweetwater people regarding locating a packing house here. The terms were 100 acres of land as a bonus, and \$50,000 worth of bonds with reasonable contract from the Sweetwater people. Word has been received by wire that the contract has been accepted and signed, and that a \$250,000 plant will be installed here as soon as possible. The company promises to handle 250 hogs a day and as many hogs and sheep as can be obtained. About 200 hands will be employed.
