women school teachers should be forced to wear dresses that come above the shoulders. She says that there is always a great deal of dust on the floors of school rooms and that the long dresses of the teachers cause this to rise in a cloud, entering the lungs of pupils and spreading consumption germs.

The National Anti-Tuberculosis league has taken the matter up, and has decided to send a commission to the school board of every large city in the country, requesting them to issue an order making it mandatory on the teachers to wear "short" dresses.

Will Appeal to Mayors. If this appeal is unsuccessful, it is announced, the matter will be called to the attention of the mayor of each city, and he will be requested to have an ordinance passed making short skirts mandatory.

"The very idea," said one fair El Paso teacher, when she heard of the short skirt crusade. "Why, it is an outrage. It is all right for women who do not have to stand on their feet all day and who can wear nice shoes. But we teachers are on our feet six hours a day, and we have to wear shoes that are comfortable, even if they are old and dilapidated."

Long Dresses Hide Shoes. "Long dresses cover old footwear, and, of course, they are not noticeable to the pupils or to persons we pass going to and from school."

"You will seldom or never see a school teacher wearing new shoes in the school room, and furthermore—here her voice sank to a whisper—"you will seldom see a school teacher with small feet."

"Why," went on the teacher, who is young and pretty, "such an order would show us up terribly. Those of us who have large pedal extremities are able to hide them under long dresses, and no one is any the wiser. But with short skirts our big feet and old shoes would stand revealed in all their ugliness."

"Why, we might lose the respect of our pupils. They might even laugh at us, and it would thus be a blow to discipline."

"Are you speaking now for the bulk of the teachers, or for those of your acquaintances?" the fair teacher was asked.

"Well," she remarked, hesitatingly and blushing, "I can speak for several of my acquaintances with authority, and their feet would not win any Cinderella prizes. I can assure you."

Says Few Have Small Feet. "And from what I have heard," she went on, still blushing, "90 percent of the teachers are of the type that cannot brag about. Some of them may have small feet, but they do not encase them in the fashionable gear you see illustrated in the shoemakers' advertisements. No, indeed. If they did their chiroplast bills would be larger than their salaries. Besides, standing all day is not conducive to shapely pedal extremities."

"If this 'short top' order is put into effect the board of education will have to increase our salaries so that we can pay for nice shoes and for taking care of our feet, if for no other reason. But even at that it will cause a big howl. I can tell you."

The teacher admitted there might be something in the theory that germs are sent flying through the air by long skirts, but said she thought the proposed remedy was worse than the cure.

Would Be Tortured. "Look at the torture we would have to endure," she said, "making our feet look small and new. Why, we would rather run the risk of inhaling the germs, and so, too, I think, would the pupils, rather than have to look all day on the feet of their teachers."

"It might also cause considerable envy and jealousy among the teachers themselves, for those with shapely ankles might want to wear dresses even shorter than the order called for, and they would be sure to have the laugh on those whose ankles have about the same outlines as a piano leg."
