INDIAN FORGERS CAN NOT BE TRIED

Government Does Not Hold Them Amenable For Such Offense.

If you are an Indian, a real full blooded Indian, not the cigar store kind, they cannot prosecute you for a forgery in Arizona. So the red man may be a "Jim the Peasant," and not be prosecuted for it, all because in the making of the laws to which Indians in the territory are amenable, they forgot to include this offense.

This fact recently developed in Phoenix when the government disallowed various items in a bill rendered by Maricopa county authorities for the prosecution of criminal Indians.

Lo, the poor Indian, may be prosecuted for seven different offenses against the territorial laws, but he has the best of his pale face brother on one score. He may forge the name of the president or anyone else and they may not prosecute him, all because they forgot that even an Indian might do such a thing.

Indians have been prosecuted on this charge and have served terms in the penitentiary for the offense, but their conviction has been illegal.

DETECTIVES ARREST MAN ON BURGLARY CHARGE

P. C. Weaver was arrested by detectives Friday on a charge of burglarizing a room in the Delmar hotel and taking an overcoat therefrom, about a week ago. He was transferred to the county jail and will be given a preliminary hearing in the justice court Monday.

The local detectives express the opinion that Weaver looks a great deal like the man who, a little over a week ago, hired a team at Alamogordo, N. M., drove to El Paso and sold the outfit. They also say that he resembles the photograph of a man wanted in Phoenix for a similar offense. He denies that he is the person wanted.
