## Mining News of the Great Southwest

### PARRAL DISTRICT MINES ARE NOW MAKING MANY BIG IMPROVEMENTS

The Palmilla Company Has Work Started on Mill and Nevada-Colorado Is Finishing Plant.

J. L. Johnston, general manager of the Parral-Chihuahua Mines company, and also operating the Jibosa mines, 15 miles south of Jimenez, left last night for Parral. Mr. Johnston has been in the city, being treated for injuries received from a fall at the mine. The mines of the Parral-Chihuahua company are about eight miles southeast of Santa Barbara, consisting of the San Miguel, a silver-lead proposition, the Santa Edwigis, a silver-copper proposition. These are practically new properties, now under active development, and are yielding plenty of shipping ore. The stockholders are chiefly Atlanta, Ga., and Chattanooga, Tenn., people.

**Work Starts on Mill.** He states that the Palmilla Milling company, at Parral, has the foundation of the big mill plant set, and will have the first unit of 250 tons in operation by the end of four months. The plant will eventually be a 1000 ton mill. It is to be a milling, concentrating and cyaniding plant. James E. Long is general manager of the company, and of the Alvarado Consolidated Mines company, and F. C. Morehouse is the consulting engineer. The Nevada-Colorado Mining and Smelting company is finishing up the 250 ton unit of the 500 ton mill, a mixed plant for concentrating and cyaniding. The construction is under the personal management of Bernard J. McDonald, of McDonald Bros., of Guanajuato. The name of the mine is the Porfirio Diaz, and it is one of the heaviest producers of the Minas Nuevas camp in Parral district.

leaching, the sodium hypsulphide process to be used. The Alfama company has been organized and has taken over the Alfama mine in the Santa Barbara camp, and is preparing to do some great work. This mine was formerly owned by French people, but has been idle several years. Under the new regime the old hoists and machinery are being overhauled and new pumps have been ordered. Development work is in progress, and tests are being made to determine the best method of treating the ore, with the probability that cyaniding will be adopted. T. C. Morehouse, formerly manager of the San Pedro Mining company at Guanacavi, is consulting engineer.

**HOISTING MACHINERY INSTALLED AT SACRAMENTO SHAFT.** Bisbee, Ariz., March 2.—Work of installing the big hoisting machinery at the Sacramento shaft has been completed, and operations of hoisting the ore from all mines of the Copper Queen through one shaft, the Sacramento, are proceeding satisfactorily. The engine is handling the output easily, with plenty of capacity to spare. The ore is transported to the Sacramento shaft from other mines by electric locomotives.

**Big Tonnage Developed.** The Manser Bradley, of the Prieto mine, is opening a very large body of fine ore in Sierra de la Cruz, and has about finished the new mill. E. A. Swain is operating the Tajo mine, a silver-zinc proposition, in Sierra de la Cruz, and is running the mill with quite a tonnage of ore. Jose Ma. Botello is operating a mine on the same vein as the Prieto, Sierra de la Cruz. **Santa Barbara Camp.** In Santa Barbara camp, the Tecolote Mining company is concentrating over 800 tons of ore a day, and is completing a zinc extraction plant to separate zinc from lead and iron contents by means of a magnetic separator. The San Diego group, owned by the Torreon Smelter company, will soon resume milling operations. This group has a large tonnage of milling ore blocked out under the management of J. H. Cooper, who for the past two years has been steadily developing and blocking out ore bodies, so there are reserves for the next two years. The Hines Consolidated company is also doing development work and shipping, although not running the mill at present. The San Francisco del Oro, of George R. Jacobs and associates, one of the big producers of Santa Barbara, expects to resume operations in a short time on a large scale, and planning the erection of a mill to treat the refractory, low grade ores on the dump, which will probably be treated by

### TO ERECT MILL AT KINGMAN

Bi Metal Completes Plan for Improvement—Strike at Chloride.

Kingman, Ariz., March 2.—E. H. Lamont, manager of the Bi Metal mine at Maguire, three miles south from Kingman, has returned from Denver, where all plans for the immediate erection of a 40 stamp mill have been completed. Bids have been received from nine machinery firms, and the contract will be let within the next few days. Lamont expects to have the actual work of construction started not later than April 15. The Bi Metal, which has been under development by the present management for the past two years, has been thoroughly prospected by three shafts and numerous open cuts. The result of this development, as shown by many months of sampling and resampling, during which large tonnages of ore were virtually quarried, and then without sorting run through a 10 stamp test mill, is a body of ore estimated at 2,500,000 tons, assaying a little over 24 in gold.

Several miles farther south, in the same district, considerable work is being started on the Gold Butte and Fay Bonanza properties. Lewis Lusk, of Spokane, one of the principal owners, has been examining the prospects with a good result. The entire bottom of a 40 foot shaft on the Butte assays 28, while 10 inches of ledge in the Fay Bonanza runs 108; samples taken across 20 feet of ledge on the surface averaged 214. Lusk proposes to sink several hundred feet and then cross cut.

**Strike at Chloride.** In the Chloride camp a strike was made in the Rainbow mine on the 225 foot level, 115 feet north from the main shaft. The vein had been split for about 100 feet, and the west fork, a small streak of variable values, had been followed, when the two branches united again to form four feet of good ore between well defined walls. Ten inches of the ledge assays from \$40 to \$80, and the remainder is a good grade of milling ore. The breast is now being driven between the south ore shoot, which is developed to a depth of 246 feet, with ore blocked out for a length of 150 feet. The Pilgrim mine, 12 miles west from Chloride, owned by Bill O'Day, is being worked by engineers representing Spurr & Cox, of New York. The Pilgrim is in the same range as the Gold Road mine, and has ore of a similar character. It averages about 28 in free milling gold, and there have been very large tonnages developed in the last two years. The Venture company, of Duluth,

**DRIVE NEW TUNNEL.** Bisbee, Ariz., March 2.—Development work is being carried on successfully at the Nebraska and Arizona property, located in Cochise county. The shaft has already reached a depth of 180 feet, and sinking will be continued until the 200 foot level is reached, when cross-cutting and drifting work will be done. Though the rock encountered in the sinking of the shaft has been very hard, work has progressed. A tunnel is being driven into the side of the mountain northwest of the shaft, and lead ore in fair proportions has been encountered.

**PLAN DEVELOPMENT.** Bisbee, Ariz., March 2.—A meeting of the stockholders of the Box Canyon mining company will be held soon in order to outline plans for the future progress of the company's property. The development work done so far is represented by a tunnel driven into the mine for a considerable distance.

**HERE FROM PARRAL.** N. C. Thompson, formerly general manager of the Candelaria Mining company, at San Pedro, but now operating mines in the El Paso district, south of Parral, is in the city, and will remain a few days.

### STRIKES HOT WATER IN MONTEREY WELL


