space between the two buildings may be wide enough for a street.

**May Cut in Front Line.**  
The other plan that is being considered by the Plaza block owners is the drawing back of their front property line on Pioneer plaza in order to eliminate a portion of the projection which now interferes with traffic and gives that side of the plaza an irregular shape.

In connection with this plan, Gen. Mills has made an offer to the city to set the southeast corner of his building back 15 feet if he be permitted to extend the southwest corner out an equal distance. By doing this the passageway in front of the Sheldon would be widened to permit double street car tracks and heavy traffic to pass through the plaza without causing a blockade. A conference between the mayor and Gen. Mills' representative will be held while the general is here to consider the proposed change. Should this change be agreed to and the Plaza block owners set their property back, very nearly a straight line would be established between the Oregon street corner and the Herald building.

He had removed all cartridges but one, they declare, and that one stuck. Then he looked into the revolver to see what caused it to stick, and it went off, according to the family.
