GOVERNOR'S DAY AT CRUCES APRIL 1

Big Celebration to Be Held There With Gov. Mills as Guest.

Las Cruces, N. M., March 9.—April 1 is to be governor's day in Las Cruces for the Mesilla valley, the auspices of the Mesilla Valley chamber of commerce.

The committee in charge consists of Theo. Rouault, president of the Mesilla Valley Produce Exchange; W. E. Garrison, president of the New Mexico College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts; B. J. Viljoen, president of the West Side Farmers' association; J. C. McNary, president of the Berino-Anthony Farmers' association; Wm. Palmer, of Rincon; Martin Lohman, mayor of Las Cruces; H. B. Holt, president of the Mesilla Valley Water Users' association; Nicholas Galles, president and A. R. Coleman, secretary of the Mesilla Valley chamber of commerce.

This general committee will cooperate with the directors and will meet Thursday afternoon for the purpose of outlining a plan for this affair which is to eclipse anything of the kind ever pulled off in the valley.

SETTING OUT MANY VALLEY APPLE TREES

Mesilla Valley Realty Company at Las Cruces Plants 4163.

Las Cruces, N. M., March 9.—The Mesilla Valley Realty company has just completed setting out 4163 three-year-old apple trees on their ranch about nine miles below Las Cruces. This orchard alone when bearing will produce from 600 to 800 carloads of apples. There are many more smaller orchards being set out this spring and within the next few years this will be the apple district of the west.

COLLEGE TEAM WINS BALL GAME; ELECTS CAPTAIN

Track Team is Going to Work—Debatting Team for Territorial Contest is Selected at A. & M.

Agricultural College, N. M., March 9.—The baseball game between the college team and Los Solteros club, resulted in a score of eight to nothing in favor of the college team at the end of the ninth inning, when the game was called on account of darkness. The baseball material for the college team is unusually good and is getting into good shape for the approaching games. Arner Zele has been elected captain of the track team. The work lately done on the track has improved it very much and with an enterprising captain the season in this line of athletics is very promising.

The preliminary debate for the purpose of selecting the intercollegiate debaters for this year was on the question "Resolved, That the commission form of city government is the best form of city government." The affirmative side was supported by Briggs, Ewing and Lyon and the negative by Stewart, Rigney and Dillon. The judges' decision was in favor of the affirmative side. Briggs, Ewing and Rigney will represent the college in its intercollegiate contest with the university of New Mexico. Dillon is among the best of the speakers, but is disqualified on account of not having any work in the college this semester. It is thought that the present team is stronger than that of last year.

Jesse Sheppard, one of the students of the engineering course, met with a very severe accident while working in the shops, when a piece of metal on which he was working flew up and hit him in the eye, cutting the eyeball and injuring the sight. 
