### SAYS COUNTY WILL CONDEMN LAND

Judge Eylar Seeks Right-of-way for Car Line to Cement Plant.

"Condemnation proceedings will be taken by the county to secure a little less than a quarter of an acre of Stewart & Crawford's land, on the road to the cement plant, to secure a right-of-way for the street, and an El Paso judge Eylar this morning. They wanted \$1000 and I have been authorized to pay them only \$500, so we will have to take the matter into court. "It is really securing the land for the cement plant's benefit, but this is such a large concern and will employ so much labor that the county commissioners did not think it should be required to purchase the land in order to get the extension of the smelter line."

### JUDGE HARPER DECLINES TO REDUCE NAIL'S BOND.

W. A. Nail's counsel made an attempt to have his \$5000 bond reduced to \$2000 Wednesday, but Judge J. R. Harper refused the request and the matter will be taken before the court of criminal appeals at San Antonio. Nail was recently convicted and sentenced to serve two years in the state penitentiary on a charge of attempting to bribe assistant city attorney Volney M. Brown. After being sentenced he applied for a new trial, but this was denied and upon his serving notice of appeal to the central court, his bond was fixed at \$5000, which he sought to have reduced, claiming he could furnish \$2000.
