TAKE CENSUS OF SOUTHWEST MINES

Information to Be Held Confidential Says Government Representative.

George V. Newton, of Washington, D. C., special agent and representative of the bureau of the census department of commerce and labor, is in the city from a trip through the mining districts of New Mexico. He is engaged in getting the census of the mines, quarries and manufactories in the territory assigned to him in the southwest, viz: New Mexico.

The census of mines and quarries, says Mr. Newton, "is taken in conformity with the requirements of the act of congress approved July 2, 1909. Reports are required on this schedule for all mines and quarries that were in operation for development or productive purposes during any portion of the year ending December 31, 1909, but the statistics may pertain to the business year which most nearly conforms to the calendar year. The law makes it obligatory on the owner or operator of any mine or quarry to furnish the census data.

Many Questions Asked. To avoid duplicate inquiries, the geological survey, which collects annual statistics of production, and the bureau of the census are cooperating. The law provides that this mining census shall be taken only once in 10 years, whereas the census on manufactories is taken every five years. I think that it would have been better if the same time had been required for the census on mines. Mining is the great industry of the entire west and southwest and such a great industry certainly deserves as much attention as that of manufacturing.

I furnish each mine owner and company with a general schedule blank with questions to be answered, such as the name of the owner or operating company of the mines, number of mines, locality, period of operation, whether individual, partnership or incorporation, time of operation and hours worked, capital invested, and area of mineral and other lands held by the operator, the number of salaried employees and wage-earners, salary and wage payable, materials, supplies and fuel, miscellaneous expenses, total cost and kind of development during the year, the mechanical power employed about the mine.

In addition to the above schedule, a report must be made on the special supplemental schedule, which I furnish. Information confidential. All answers made to the questions asked in the schedules will be held absolutely confidential. No publication will be made in the census reports disclosing the name or operations of individual establishments in any particular, and the information will be used only for the statistical purposes for which it is supplied.

The act of congress provides that the bureau of the census shall not permit any other than the sworn employees of the bureau to examine the individual reports. It also provides that any employee who shall without the authority of the director of the census, publish or communicate any information coming into his possession will be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by fine and imprisonment. All the data obtained by me will therefore be held strictly confidential, and under no circumstances will this information be given to any state or local officials, tax assessors or collectors.

I earnestly wish the cheerful cooperation of all mine owners and operators to assist me in getting the correct information for the government, and I am sure that they all will do their best to assist me when they understand the object of this census taking.

GOOD ORE FROM SABINAL CAMP

El Pasoans Make a Rich Strike of Silver in Mexico Territory.

James W. Parker has received a letter and package with samples of ore from Edward Salvesson, superintendent of the Grand Central mine in the Sabinal mountains, 90 miles southwest of this city over the Mexican Northwestern. The samples are principally native silver in sheets and wires in a lime gangue. The letter says that he has just made the new strike and had sacked 15 sacks of ore similar to the samples and was still filling sacks with it. The ore will run about 8000 ounces silver a ton. The strike was made at a depth of about 75 feet. The owners are Parker, Booker and Shepherd and Winter of this city, who purchased it from Mrs. W. E. Thompson. The property has already more than repaid the purchase price.

SHIP ORE HERE FROM MEXICO

El Pasoans Have New Mining Property Near San Pedro, Mexico.

The Congreso mine at San Pedro camp, Chihuahua, on the Mexican Northwestern railroad, is now shipping from 100 to 150 tons of lead carbonate-silver-gold ore per day to the El Paso smelter. General manager George A. Laird is installing a large concentrator, having purchased the machinery recently in El Paso. The ore bodies of the Congreso mine are increasing in size and there are values every foot in depth. Work in extracting the ore, now shipping is just about the present water level. The immense dumps are steadily lowering the water from 10 to 12 inches a day. In the Isabella mine, north of the Congreso mine, work is going on steadily, and shipments are being made to the smelter. A. E. Turner is working it on a lease. This mine produces lead-carbonate ore, with silver and gold values, and has been producing for several years.

San Pablo Mine. Adjoining the Isabella on the south, and about half a mile north of the Congreso mine, is a new property, called the San Pablo, belonging to the San Pablo Mining company, composed of El Paso people, L. T. Bryant, of this city, is president and general manager. The property shows up large bodies of lead carbonates, carrying gold and silver. Development work is going on sinking a main work shaft, and in a few months it is intended to begin shipments to the smelter.

This mine lies about half way between the Congreso on the south and the famous San Nicolas on the north, and in the very heart of the great mineral zone. Paul Traillor is developing a big mining property north of San Pedro in the Capulin mountains, and is shipping to the smelter, and south in the Escopido mountains an El Paso company, headed by Pat Durack, is beginning extensive development and improvement work.

WORK RUSHED NEAR BENSON

New Gold Strike in Arizona is Attracting Much Attention.

The big gold strike at Steel hill, 18 miles east and eight miles north of Benson, Ariz., is said to be monopolizing the attention of crowds of people who are flocking into the district. The Cochise Gold Mining and Milling company has been organized, with M. H. Merrill, P. W. Corcoran, Seth Merrill, Oliver Merrill, F. W. Moody, W. J. Smith and John Mages as directors.

The company is rapidly being financed and work is going ahead night and day. The shaft is down 60 feet, with gold values in every pound of ore that comes out, and some of the ore shows the yellow metal all through it. The shaft will be sunk to the 100 foot depth, and then a crosscut will be run to ascertain the width of the vein. All the ore so far is the finest kind of free milling gold, it is said.

Stubb's Realty & Broker, who own 12 claims west of the Cochise holdings, are going to start an exploration shaft, and other mine owners in the camp are working, and the district is very lively.

MINING MARVEL NEAR FLORENCE

Montezuma Strike Is Showing Good Values in Gold and Other Contents.

It is said that the property of the Montezuma Gold Mining company, four miles from Florence, is developing into a mine marvel, showing not only most unusual richness in gold values, but an astounding variety of metallic contents. Assays made of two or three different samples by three different assayers gave the following results: (1) \$1056.20, (2) \$117.50 and (3) \$342.40, in gold per ton; and a general average of over \$500 gold a ton. The variation in these assays is due to the fact that the samples were taken from different parts of the vein, across a width of 15 feet.

The ore also contains fine particles of native copper, and carries 18 pounds of the native copper to the ton. Another discovery is reported in the same locality, said to be of greater value than the Montezuma mine, and owned by Brown & Perham. Two ranchmen, named Meyer and Troxel, made the discovery. It is on the same lode and has added to the excitement caused by the original discovery.

BOSTON MAN IS NOW INSPECTING THE SAN PEDRO

Chihuahua, Mex., March 17.—News comes from the Naleca mining camp, this state, corroborating the news that American capitalists have taken an option on the San Pedro mines of the

Compania Minera de Naleca, in that camp, at \$4,000,000, Mexican money, and put up a forfeit of \$50,000.

Francis E. Jones, of Boston, is now at the mines with engineers examining the properties thoroughly. It is not known here who are the prospective purchasers, but it is certain that a deal is on.

EXTENSIVE DEVELOPMENT IN THE DRAGON DISTRICT

The Dragon district, Coahuila county, Arizona, has been more extensively developed the past year than during all the years previously. The mines at Dragon are on the main line of the Southern Pacific.
