PUEBLO BATTLE IS CELEBRATED. Tomorrow will be a truly patriotic feast day in Juarez. It marks the anniversary of the battle of Pueblo from the French by Gen. Diaz killed in 1867. The celebration in Juarez will be strictly military. Between 9 and 10 a. m. the troops stationed at the garrison near the city will parade the principal streets led by military bands. Again at 5 and 6 p. m. the two bands will give a marching concert in the streets without the military escort.

All the young bloods and fair ones of the city will dance Saturday night at Tero Juarez at ball given by the Recreation club. The reception of guests will begin at 9 o'clock. On Sunday afternoon an amateur roping and riding contest will be held with the young men of the city and a few real Mexican cowboys as participants. There will be lots of fun, too, mule and jack, and cat and dog races. City fathers will be judges and all Juarez society and many visitors from El Paso will be present. Gate receipts will go toward the fund to make needed improvements at the centenary in September. The affair is in charge of the local centenary committee.
