more for their board than elsewhere, and therefore we must pay them more. "If the schools are growing faster than taxable values and it becomes necessary to raise money by other means for the conduct of our schools, we must devise some way to do it and make El Paso schools the best in the state.

"I, for one, will be willing to raise the tax rate and I do not believe the taxes could be raised for a more beneficial purpose than for the schools of this city. And I believe that the majority will look at it in that light.

"I did not come here to make a speech, we are now open for business. What is your purpose?"

C. W. Fassett—I wish to present the motion that this meeting nominate and endorse John H. Harper, Dr. E. H. Irvin and W. H. Winter."

After a rings ticket had been presented, Salome-like upon a silver platter by C. W. Fassett, and as, in the natural course of such events, there were no other nominations as yet, never was intended for it to be made, Judge Harper moved that "Judge Elyar tell us about the Republicans running on the other ticket."
