



STATE CAN RAISE PRICE ON OIL LAND

W. W. Turney Says Only the Minimum Price Is Fixed by State Law.

There is no law absolutely fixing the price to be charged by the state for oil mineral lands any more than for farming lands, is the opinion of W. W. Turney, rendered for The Herald in reference to the report that land commissioner Robinson had raised the price of

lands about 70c to \$30 an acre in violation of the law.

"The limit to be charged is not \$10," said the attorney, who Wednesday carefully investigated the legal status of such cases. "It is stipulated that the land shall sell for not less than \$10 or \$15 an acre, the price to vary between those amounts in correspondence to proximity to a railroad and the shipping facilities thus afforded.

"There is absolutely nothing stipulated regarding a maximum charge on the part of a commissioner. The condition is similar with other state lands of such cases. "It is stipulated that \$1 may be charged but the commissioner exceeds that price for the benefit of the state in almost every case.

"I see no legal reason why the oil land should not also be rated at a price to protect the state if conditions warrant."

GAILEY AND CLARKE WILL SUE COUNTY

Ask More Pay for Ysleta-Clint Road—Meadows Resigns.

County road engineer R. B. Meadows has resigned and will leave on May 25 for Dallas, Texas, where he will enter the employ of a large contracting firm. Meadows resigned several months ago but reconsidered his determination to leave the county when Gailey and Clarke put in a bill for 15 cents a ton extra pay for 20,000 tons of rock hauled than called for, laid on the Ysleta-Clint road.

Meadows maintained the men should not have the money and that it cost no more to lay the large rock than the smaller. The county commissioners

went down the road Wednesday and decided to leave the matter to a board of arbitration, thereby sustaining Meadows. Thursday morning, Gailey and Clarke refused to agree to arbitration and signified their intention of suing for the amount they claim is due.

A. T. Duncan was appointed constable at precinct No. 5, and A. W. Parrott justice of the peace for the same precinct.

The commissioners organized a new school precinct at La Valle, out of the eastern part of the Sierra Blanca district, and a new election precinct in the eastern end of the county with the voting place at Sayler's ranch.

An order authorizing the issuance of \$2000 in schoolhouse bonds for Van Horn, \$3800 similar bonds for Clint, and the assessment of a 17 cent tax for Clint and 2 cents for Van Horn was passed.

It was also ordered that a tax of 5 cents for maintaining the Van Horn

school house be levied.

Dr. McVeth, of Sierra Blanca, was appointed to look after smallpox cases in that section for a term of three weeks, his pay to be \$5 per day.

The offer of R. H. Rheinhart to insure the boiler in the city jail for \$5000 on which a premium of \$50 for three years must be paid, was accepted. Rheinhart explained that inspections of the boiler will be made three or four times a year.

A petition for the construction of a road from Carr's place across the Salitral ditch to the new county road, in the Socorro district, was referred to commissioner Perez. He was authorized to inform the petitioners that if the land is donated to the county, the road will be constructed.

FOUR BALL GAMES POSTPONED WEDNESDAY

New York City, May 11.—Rain caused postponement of two National league

games today, Brooklyn at Pittsburg, and Philadelphia at Cincinnati.

Wet grounds caused the postponement of the Cleveland at Philadelphia game, and rain the postponement of Chicago at Washington, both of the American league.

TAFT MEETS WITH MORE PARTY OPPOSITION

His Plan for Tariff Investigations Is Opposed by Some of the Strong Leaders in Congress.

Washington, D. C., May 11.—President Taft is now facing a new party complication. In his effort to obtain an appropriation of \$250,000 to enable the new tariff board to ascertain the difference in the cost of production here and abroad and thus lay the foundation for another tariff revision based on accurate and scientific information, it was said today the president would have the opposition of representatives

James W. Clark, an attorney, died in El Paso Tuesday on his way from Silver City, N. M., to his home at Cedar Rapids, Ia. He was removed from the train here, dying after a few hours in the city. Mr. Clark was 36 years of age. The body will be shipped east Wednesday night.
