

SAYS BRIBERY JURY WAS PACKED

State's Attorney Declares Jurors Were Signaled From Outside.
Chicago, Ill., June 29.—After the jury had been discharged in the bribery case of Lee O'Neill Brown, state's attorney Wayman created a sensation by declaring to newspaper men that the jury had been packed.

"This is the most flagrant case of jury fixing I have ever seen," he said. "It would seem that these courtrooms are constructed to make it easy to 'fix' jurors and this case is a good example. The jury was packed from the start."

Notwithstanding the statement of several jurors that they stood eight to four for conviction throughout, Mr. Wayman declared the jury at one time stood 11 to one for conviction.

The state's attorney declared that men had been signaling the jurors from the windows of a hotel across the street from the criminal court building.
