Grand Trunk Strike Is Becoming Serious

Montreal, Canada, July 20.—Freedom from serious disorder continues to characterize the condition of the strike of Grand Trunk trainmen.

The road is maintaining its more important passenger schedules, but the problem confronting the officials, is the continued and apparently complete paralysis of its freight traffic.

Many carloads of perishable freight are standing on sidings and unless the wheels are turned soon the property loss will be large.

Leaders of both sides say all thought of arbitration or compromise has been abandoned.

STRIKE BREAKERS FOR GRAND TRUNK

Many Arrive in New England—Old Employees Have Permission to Return.

Boston, Mass., July 20.—Strikebreakers from all parts of the country continue to pour into New England today to take the places of the conductors and trainmen on the Grand Trunk and Central Vermont railroads, now on a strike for higher wages.

At St. Albans, Vt., headquarters of the Central Vermont system, and at other Vermont points, strikebreakers were being flooded with telegrams urging them not to fill the places of strikers and, in several instances, these efforts have been successful.

One official of the Central Vermont road has announced that any of the striking employes may have their old positions at higher wages if they make applications immediately.

The Grand Trunk, however, has stated that if any strikers come back they must come as new men.

STRIKE IN ENGLAND TAKES ON SERIOUS PROPORTIONS.

New Castle, Eng., July 20.—The strike against the Northeastern railroad was strengthened today.

Ten thousand men had quit work last night and every hour since has brought reports of further desertions.

Coal ships are tied up, unable to obtain cargoes. Many factories along the river Tyne have shut down pending the outcome of the dispute.

DEAD SOLDIER, MEMBER OF PROMINENT FAMILY

Believed That S. E. Welch, Who Died Here Was Connected With Prominent Boston Family.

M. E. Welch, who died at the county hospital appears to be of a prominent Boston family.

LUMBER RATES ARE REDUCED FOR TEXAS.

Washington, D. C., July 20.—The interstate commerce commission today decided that rates on yellow pine lumber from points in Louisiana, Texas, Arkansas and Missouri to points in Nebraska, Colorado and Wyoming reached by the lines of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy, and other carriers are unreasonably high and the roads are required to put reduced rates into effect.

New York, N. Y., July 20.—Another supposed case of the whereabouts of Dr. Harry Crippen, wanted in London for the murder of his wife, Belle Elmore, was run down without result today on the arrival of the steamer Kronland.

A man and wife who boarded the steamer Dover and who were suspected of being Crippen and Miss Levee, turned out to be a clergyman and his wife from a small town in Delaware.
