work, the windows draped with heavy tapestry, and the room lighted with masses of flowers.

Also on the third floor is a card room in green, a large pool and billiard room, with soft green floors and walls tinted into a yellow ceiling to afford a desirable distribution of light through curtained windows. In the wide corridor leading from the elevator and stairs, is the club office and the private telephone exchange. Directly off is a small room to be used by the directors of the club.

**Comfort a Feature.**  
Then comes a large lounge room for the comfort seeking. There all is in brown, big brown wickered easy chairs, fretted walls of soft brown wainscoting to a brownish yellow of the ceilings. There is a large table in the center of the room, giving the home library touch, and a huge fireplace with rustic andirons. The walls are hung with bright colored prints. Also there is a writing room.

Third floor is women's floor, for there are the hall room and lounge rooms for the fair ones. A large room of feminine appearance is provided for rest and toilet. There are many white wicker chairs and dainty dressing tables. Then there is the reception room for women to study in green. Huge green armchairs stand out in relief against light brown frescoed walls, green draperies at windows, rich rugs. Also there is a women's card room, even larger than the men's.

**Ball Room Attractive.**  
A dream of rich colors, with a predominance of pink, is the ball room. Across one end is a gallery, opposite stand high draped windows. Above the expanse of floor are beamed ceilings, supported by four huge pillars trimmed in gold. The whole is a study in delicate tints and warm colors.

As yet the public dining room, located off the street between the store space, is not completed. However, the grill room will serve the demands of the club members. The kitchen is located by means of dumb waiters. A freight elevator runs to the top floor.

### POLICEMAN SHOOT AT MEXICAN BOY

**W. H. Glenn Captures Runaway Accused of Taking Shoes.**  
A shot fired by policeman Haynes in an effort to stop a Mexican boy who was trying to make away with a pair of shoes, created commotion on Mills street between Stanton and Meigs streets, Monday morning. The Mexican escaped by running up the alley. Meantime W. H. Glenn, an employee of Lee Orndorff, had better luck in his attempt to capture a partner of the Mexican who escaped the officer, and landed his man after a chase through the alley to Texas street. The young Mexican gave his name as Luis Griego, but declared he did not know the name of his companion.

The popular shoe repair shop, situated at the corner of Stanton and Mills, has suffered a loss of a dozen pair of shoes in the past few days, according to the proprietor. The young Mexican arrested, and his companion who escaped, he declares, have been in there frequently. Monday morning, he says, he caught them taking two pairs of shoes and immediately gave the alarm. Officer Haynes, dressed in civilian's clothes, happened to be near and immediately gave chase. Glenn took after the other Mexican and had but little difficulty in overtaking him.

### CARLISLE IS CLAIMED AFTER SHORT ILLNESS

Prominent Democratic Politician Dies in New York Apartments; Held Treasury Position.

New York, N. Y., Aug. 1.—John G. Carlisle died at his apartment in New York Sunday night after an illness of two days. Death was caused by heart failure accompanied by edema of the lungs.

John Griffin Carlisle, who was former secretary of the treasury, was born in Kenton county, Ky., on September 5, 1835. From 1877 to 1890 he was a member of the national house of representatives, and from 1893 to 1899 was speaker. He resigned to fill the unexpected term of James B. Beck in the United States senate, from which he again resigned in 1907 to become secretary of the treasury under president Grover Cleveland.

With the retirement from power of the Democratic party in 1897, he withdrew from politics and took up the practice of law in New York City.

### SOCORRO KILLING LEADS TO ARREST

**Sam Johnson Arrested in Connection With Katzenstein's Death.**  
Socorro, N. M., Aug. 1.—Sam Johnson, the prisoner who was captured at San Marcial, is confined in the Socorro county jail and shows evidence of mental distress and anxiety. Johnson has made a full statement to the officials, some of which has been corroborated, and puts a new theory in some features of the case.

Frank Schmidt, alias Colway, has a mother who resides at Deming. At the time of his flight he had only about \$1 in his possession. There have been several rumors here to the effect that Frank Schmidt was captured but no kind of confirmation.

Some indications have been discovered that Schmidt was captured in his southern course and started in a northward direction. Rewards are being raised and will be announced shortly. His army experiences is proving valuable to him. It is reported that he served 12 years in one regiment, but his statement in this regard cannot be confirmed. Sheriff Sanchez and his men are working hard, although the fugitive's movements are baffling.

Train crews are cooperating in keeping a watch for Conway.

The funeral of the deceased was very largely attended. A groom was shrouded over Socorro since the killing but at the funeral it was more marked than ever. Relatives of the deceased, boyhood friends, associates in business, and the general public were represented. The local fire brigade, of which the deceased was foreman, was in attendance. Members of the city council, fraternal organizations and social societies paid a last tribute to the memory of Emik Katzenstein.

### GRAND JURY PROBES NEGRO RACE RIOTS

**Four Men Under Arrest at Palestine—Trouble Subsides.**  
Palestine, Texas, Aug. 1.—With four men arrested in connection with the killing of a number of negroes in the vicinity of Slocum late Friday night and Saturday, the grand jury began its session here this afternoon to probe thoroughly the outbreak which spread terror over the whole of Anderson county and adjacent portions of eastern Texas.

The men arrested are John Spurgers, Wallace Ferguson, Josh Bishop, Thomas Garnett. Other arrests are expected this afternoon and tonight, according to the statements of the authorities.

At least 15, and it may be 20 negroes, all of them probably unarmed, were hunted down and killed by a mob of from 200 to 300 men in the Slocum and Denison Springs neighborhood of Palestine, according to the opinion of Sheriff Black, who returned after 24 hours in the district. He told of a fierce man hunt in the woods, of riddled bodies found on lonely roads and of the terror almost indescribable among the inhabitants in the southeastern part of Anderson county.

### MANY OFFICERS AT SCENE OF KILLING

Dallas, Texas, Aug. 1.—Reports from Palestine, Texas, indicate that a calmer feeling exists in Anderson and Houston counties where it is believed 15 negroes were slain by a band of whites Friday and Saturday. Deputy sheriffs and state rangers are at the scene of the trouble.

### GEORGIA WRECK RESULTS

Augusta, Ga., Aug. 1.—Two fatalities resulted from the Charleston and Western Carolina railroad train upon a burning trestle about a mile and a half from Woodlawn Sunday, resulting in the destruction of the train, the death of the engineer and fireman, and slight injury to 16 passengers.

The engine plunged through the trestle to the creek below, pulling with it the tender, baggage car and the front of the first passenger coach.

### TEXAS TOWN HAS FIRE LOSS

Plainview, Tex., Aug. 1.—A Sunday morning destroyed an entire block in a month's store to his old home at Fayetteville, Ga., and resumed his duties on the police force. On his way home the officer visited in Atlanta, Mobile, New Orleans and San Antonio.

### KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS MEET IN MILWAUKEE

Milwaukee, Wis., Aug. 1.—The 12th biennial convention of the Knights of Pythias closed here today. Twelve thousand knights in uniform rank are in camp.

### CHINESE MAYOR SAYS HE WAS ASSAULTED

**Mar Wing Kee Complains That Another Chinaman Pulled His Queue.**  
An interesting war has broken out in Chinatown. It is the Mar wing that are allied against each other down below Overland street on South Oregon. The mainstrom of Chinese dissension is circling around the diminutive pig tailed head of Mar Wing Kee, Chinese merchant and pioneer El Pasano. Mar Wing Kee says he has been a victim of an attempt to blackmail with the usual Chinese man sequel for money.

The serenity of Mar King's Sunday evening smoke in front of his South Oregon street shop was broken by a rude and vicious attack on the little Oriental merchant. Mar says he was just starting around the corner to get his evening cigar when he was suddenly attacked from the rear. Ruthlessly and without respect for his age, Mar Wing says, the assailant grabbed him by the right side of his head, pulled and threw him to the ground, taking several inches of Chinese skin off of his elbow, thumping him in the ribs and otherwise breaking the golden rule of the Chinese which is to respect the aged.

Mar Wing Kee says it was Mar Chung who attacked him. He also says Mar Chung has been threatening him for some time. The ingratitude of it all is in the fact that Mar Wing had helped Mar Chung to settle up his affairs after he went broke as manager of the City Kitchen on Broadway. He says Mar Chung asked for money with the implied threat that if no money was forthcoming there would be trouble. Mar Wing kept consulting his American lawyers. It was decided that the diminutive Chinese should desert temporarily his home on South Oregon street and sleep down town to prevent any danger of violence.

Mar says he has a lot of cousins down there who will protect him, but to be on the safe side he is going to town to do his sleeping in the future. The Mars are cousins once or twice removed. The war is an interesting one. Mar Wing says he is interested in the standing by Mar Wing Kee in his trouble.

### MISSIONARY WORKERS TO CONVENE IN COLORADO

Denver, Colo., Aug. 1.—The first Rocky Mountain summer conference of the Young People's Missionary movement of the United States and Canada will convene at Cascade, Colo., August 2, and will last ten days. The object of the conference is to give to Sunday school workers and young people's societies the best possible equipment to give missionary education to the rising generation.

The general conference will be under the direction of Rev. John M. Moore of Boston. He will present for discussion "The Missionary Committee," "Missionary Educational Policies," "Mission Prayer," and kindred themes. R. E. Dwyer, director of New York will have charge of the Sunday school section.

### ILLINOIS HOUSE LEADER FACES SECOND TRIAL

Chicago, Ill., Aug. 1.—Lee O'Neil Browne, Democratic house leader of the Illinois legislature, faced trial today for the second time on a charge of having bribed fellow members of the legislature to vote for William Lorimer for United States senator. State's attorney Wayman said today he would have some new evidence, chiefly, it was understood, from Miss Ella Christie, of Springfield, with whom it is said Browne was confidential concerning matters out of which the present charges grew.

Muzzles are in much greater evidence on the streets of El Paso than they were a few days ago, yet the number whose owners have not complied with the law is considerable. There have been not a few cases of hydrophobia, hence the unusual activity of the dog catcher at the present time.

Quite a number of stray dogs are in the city pound, but only a few have been killed. The owners, upon learning of the predicament of their pets, usually lose little time in securing their release and buying a muzzle.
