Walker, secretary-treasurer of the Central Labor union and a member of the Labor Day committee, commenting upon the arrangements, said: "I have attended every meeting of the Labor Day committee and find everybody working in complete accord and with but one object in view, and that to make this year's parade and celebration the best ever had before."
