Coal Lands Opened Up. Washington, D. C., Aug. 15.—The coal lands in North and South Dakota, amounting to about a million acres, which were recently withdrawn from the public domain by president Taft, have been opened to homestead settlement under the act passed at the last session of congress authorizing agricultural entries on coal lands. The title

to the coal and the right to prospect for, mine and remove is reserved to the United States, but the surface of the lands is thrown open to settlers.

most radical step attempted by a political organization in many years. The keynote of Judge Terrell's address at Dallas was the declaration that the party was free from negro domination or influence and while an attitude of justice towards the negro race would be maintained at all times, the party was controlled by white men for white men. The credit for this state of affairs was given to Col. Cecil A. Lyon, state chairman of the Republican executive committee.

Such an announcement five years ago would have been suicidal to the political ambitions of any man in the Republican ranks in Texas. That the announcement was cheered heartily and commended so enthusiastically by the delegates at the Dallas convention shows the change wrought in Texas in the past few years. The cry of the Republicans from now on will be that the party is truly a white man's party. Every citizen of Texas will be invited in with the assurance that the support of the Republican candidates will not mean the encouragement of negro domination or have the least effect on the race question.

TERRELL TO OPEN HIS CAMPAIGN ON AUGUST 27. San Antonio, Tex., Aug. 15.—J. O. Terrell, Republican nominee for governor, will formally open his campaign for governor at Corpus Christi Saturday, August 27. He will speak there at the congressional convention which will nominate Noah Allen, of Brownsville, for congress against John E. Garner, the Democratic nominee.

Immediately after the convention Mr. Terrell will speak at a number of other places. He expects to deliver about 20 speeches between now and the November election, visiting all of the larger cities of the state.

DAMAGE SUIT FILED IN FEDERAL COURT

Minnesota People Claim That They Paid Money For Land.

W. C. Welborn of Peecs, Reeves county, is the defendant in a suit filed in the federal court, the complainants being Grant Robinson and J. B. Ladd of St. Paul, Minn. It is alleged by the petitioners that the defendant received \$3500 from them for the purchase of sections 245 and 246, block 13, of the H. & G. N. railroad lands, Reeves county, specifically in the Topsy valley, and after receiving the money refused to convey the lands to the complainants. The petition states that the defendant represented to them that he did not have the money to develop the lands and they agreed to furnish the money, to be repaid to the community. The complainants claim to have advanced \$3000 for the option on the land and \$500 for the first payment. They ask repayment in the sum expended by them and \$500 additional for expenses.

WOMAN ATTEMPTS TO COMMIT SUICIDE

Three Efforts of Susie Massey of Seventh Street Unavailing.

"What's the use of living. No one cares for me," expressed the victim of the attempt by Susie Massey of Seventh street, when locked in the city jail at 1 o'clock Tuesday morning after she had three attempts to take her own life. After wood alcohol and kerosene were taken from the heads of matches, the woman had fallen to end her life, in water, had failed to attempt to strangle herself with a towel. The arrival of the police frustrated her plans. The woman is being held at the police station. Just what disposition will be made of the case is not yet known.

TWO NEGRESSES ENGAGE IN A LIVELY COMBAT.

One Woman Is Badly Slashed With a Razor and Both Are Arrested on a Charge of Fighting.

Two dusky Amazons, of the tribe of Ethiopian, gave a life exhibiting of gladiatorial combats of old on El Paso street, near Third, Monday. As a result Ida Robinson has her left cheek slashed open from eye to mouth, a razor having been the instrument of warfare. She and May Olmar, also fitted as to color, are in the city jail awaiting trial on charges of fighting. Mounted officer Ike Stevens, who made the arrests, says the women fought like tigers, until both were exhausted. Even after having been cut the Robinson woman did not quit. There were 50 bystanders, says the officer, but none of them offered to stop the fight. Stevens' clothes were so smeared with blood that he was compelled to change his uniform after having made the arrests. Dr. A. H. Butler dressed the injured woman's wound.

The home office of the company will be in Albuquerque, where the new company will erect a six story reinforced concrete building which will be occupied by the allied companies, the Occidental Fire, Life and Accident Insurance companies. The ground has already been bought.

The Occidental Fire will be incorporated under the laws of New Mexico for \$200,000, all of which will be fully paid up in cash. George Rosington is to be the controller of the new company which is planning to extend its business from coast to coast and will establish offices in every city in the United States.
