NOTICE OF STOCKHOLDERS' AND DIRECTORS' MEETING. Notice is hereby given that the regular annual meeting of the stockholders of the El Paso & Northwestern Railroad company, a corporation organized under the laws of the state of Texas, will be held at the office of the company at No. 615 El Paso & Southwestern building, El Paso, Texas, commencing at 10 o'clock a. m., Wednesday, September 14th, 1910, and upon the same date, immediately upon adjournment of such stockholders' meeting, there will be held at the same place the regular annual meeting of the board of directors of such company for the election of its officers for the ensuing year, and the transaction of such other business as may come before the board.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE SALE OF UNDRAWN FOWLS AND POULTRY. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO:

It shall be unlawful for any person within the corporate limits of the city of El Paso to sell, expose for sale, offer for sale or in any manner keep for sale any slaughtered fowl or poultry, whether the same shall have been drawn within one hour after same shall have been slaughtered. By the term or expression "drawn" is meant the removal of the intestines from the interior, and by the term "undrawn fowl" is meant a fowl from the interior of which the intestines have not wholly removed, and any person offending against this ordinance shall be fined not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars.

This ordinance shall not apply to any wild game bird weighing less than three pounds.

A great public emergency having arisen the charter rule requiring that an ordinance be read at two successive regular meetings of the City Council, is hereby suspended by the consent of the mayor and the unanimous vote of the aldermen present, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
