

CHARLES WATSON MAY BE TRIED SATURDAY MORNING

Man Who Surrendered to Sheriff Following Killing of Charles Davis Declines to Make Statement.

Charles Watson, the negro who surrendered in sheriff Hall's office Friday morning in connection with the killing Thursday night of Charles Davis, another negro, will probably have a preliminary hearing Saturday morning before Justice Watson.

Watson, after his surrender, was taken to the county jail by deputy sheriff Greet. He refused to make a statement concerning the case, saying his lawyers would attend to that.

According to acquaintances of the two negroes, the trouble between the men originated in Biebee two years ago, at which time it is said Watson got the best of Davis.

Davis is said to have a divorced wife in St. Louis, where he formerly lived. His funeral will be held Saturday.

TEXAS BANK CASHIER UNDER INDICTMENT

Dallas, Texas, Sept. 9.—Charging him with illegally receiving bank deposits, three indictments were returned in the district criminal court here yesterday against W. C. Wiltzer, formerly cashier of the suspended Western Bank and Trust company of this city.

The bank failed in January, 1908 for more than \$1,000,000.

A CHINESE TONG WAR IS REVIVED

Mar Chew Causes Arrest of Yee Choey on Charge of Making Threats.

The Chinese tong war has again started, Mar Chew, proprietor of the Eastern Grill and one of the best known and wealthiest Chinamen in El Paso, being the intended victim, according to his statements. Yee Choey, arrested Thursday night and taken to the county jail is charged with being responsible for the trouble. His case was set for hearing before Justice McClintock Friday afternoon, where, if the intentions of Mar Chew are carried out, Choey will give a peep boy.

In the complaint filed against Yee Choey, he is charged with threatening the life of Mar, "murder," being the word used in the complaint.

According to Mar Chew, Choey and several other Chinamen have threatened his life unless he accedes to their request for money.

Choey was arrested Thursday night in a small room on South Oregon street by deputy constable Brown. The warrant for the arrest was sworn out by Mar Chew Thursday morning.

ARMY ENGINEERS COME NEXT MONTH

Board Appointed by President to Investigate Irrigation Now En Route.

The board of army engineers appointed by president Taft to inspect government irrigation plants are at present in the northwest, and will come to the southwest by way of Utah and perhaps to Los Angeles before they reach the irrigation projects on the Rio Grande and Pecos. The board consists of Lieut. Col. John Biddle, Lieut. Col. William C. Langfitt, Maj. William M. Hartz, Maj. Charles W. Katz and Maj. Harry Burgess. Director F. H. Newell, of the reclamation service and Gen. Marshall, retired, advisor to the secretary of the interior, will be in the party. It is not known just when the party will reach El Paso, but it will be some time early next month.
