open the question of what size to make the reservoir and cause delay. Having arrived at the conclusion that the dam will be built and that the waters of the upper Rio Grande belong to the people of the lower river by priority rights, the leaders of the fight in Colorado, El Paso speakers said, have now concentrated their fight on the contention that the Elephant Butte dam is too big and that it should be reduced in its storage capacity to 600,000 or less. The El Pasoans all resolved to work hard when they reach Pueblo, and to try to get a bigger delegation to go.

**The Trip to Pueblo.**  
Leaving El Paso at 8 o'clock Saturday evening the Rio Grande valley irrigation special will start for Pueblo with 75 delegates to the congress on board. Preceding the departure a parade will be given through the streets, headed by the band which will accompany the party to Pueblo.

At Las Cruces a stop of one hour will be made to take on the 25 Mesilla valley delegates who will represent the upper valley at the congress. A band concert will also be given there. Arriving in Albuquerque Sunday morning, a band concert will be given there and the party will be joined by Felix Martinez, who left Wednesday morning for Albuquerque to arrange for a delegation from that city.

Another concert will be given at Las Vegas. The run will then be made through to Pueblo, where the special train will be parked and the headquarters established at Congress hotel, where arrangements for a meeting place and campaign quarters have been made.

This special train will consist of three standard sleepers, a tourist car for the Mexican band and a diner. The delegates from the entire Rio Grande valley will go as one delegation and will make their homes on the special during the stay at Albuquerque. J. A. Happer and C. A. Kinne are in charge of the arrangements for the excursion, while Felix Martinez, R. F. Burges, J. A. Smith and others will lead the fight in the congress as the representatives of the Water Users' association.

**Colorado Speculators.**  
D. M. Payne, president of the chamber of commerce, presided at the mass meeting Tuesday night and also made a short speech in which he pointed out that the backbone of the fight against the Elephant Butte project is made up of the capitalists of Denver who are speculating during the stay at Albuquerque. This is not the case of the lower Rio Grande valley land owners, he said, as they were fighting for their homes and their rights.

"They claim that our reservoir is too big, that 2,000,000 acre feet of water is too much and that 600,000 acre feet or less would be enough for our uses," says Felix Martinez.

"They are going to try to show by a minority report that we are trying to hog too much water. They will try to have the secretary of the interior, and if not the secretary, then congress, compel the reduction of this important reservoir."

This is our plan. We will show by expert witnesses and by legal arguments that we need 2,000,000 acre feet. F. H. Newell, L. C. Hill, A. P. Davis, of the reclamation service, all say that it cannot be done with less.

"We must make the fight of our life there, if need be. They want to use the moral influence of the irrigation congress to secure this adverse action. That it will die in the resolutions committee is certain, I believe. We have powerful friends. But they will bring in a minority report and we must be ready to defeat it."

**"El Pasoans Slow."**  
Mr. Martinez then told the meeting that the people of El Paso seemed to be suffering from hookworm; that they needed to go to the Salt River valley of Arizona and to the Imperial valley of California to see what the people who were in a positive state of being were doing. Even Las Cruces was showing more nerve than the El Paso valley, he said, and lands were being sold for more, up there, than they believed in what they were doing. R. F. Burges and J. A. Happer spoke along the same lines. Mr. Burges said it was the first time the Coloradoans had ever had anything practical on

## EL PASOANS READY TO PROTECT THEIR RIGHTS TO RIO GRANDE WATERS

Will Go to Pueblo Ready to Fight the Colorado Delegation in Committee and on Floor of the Irrigation Congress—Colorado to Bring Fighting Delegation to Pueblo—Land Speculation After Water of Rio Grande.

Ready for a fight, a frolic or both, the Rio Grande valley delegation to the National Irrigation congress at Pueblo will leave El Paso Saturday evening. At a mass meeting Tuesday evening the plan of campaign was gone over by the generals who will lead the fight against Colorado, if Colorado seeks a fight. Protective vigilance is to be the keynote of the Rio Grande valley delega-

rights to the waters of the river grand, theirs by right of law and equity. The position of the lower Rio Grande regarding the expected opposition of Colorado to the Elephant Butte project was stated by Mr. Martinez, representing the Water Users' association, R. F. Burges, who will conduct the legal side of the fight at Pueblo; and J. A. Happer for the chamber of commerce.

**Colorado's Fight.**  
The Colorado delegation, led by senator Patterson, will make a desperate effort to have a resolution passed by the irrigation congress favoring the reduction of the amount of water to be impounded in the Elephant Butte reservoir from 2,000,000 acre feet to 600,000 acre feet or less. This, falling in the committee of resolutions as it is expected to do, the Colorado contingent will try to bring in a minority report and fight it out on the floor of the congress with the sole purpose of placing the Elephant Butte project in the position of being in danger, the speakers said.

The danger is not from any chance these men may have of stopping the lower Rio Grande project, Mr. Martinez and Mr. Burges said, but in the possibility of delay in Washington should action be taken at Pueblo. It would
