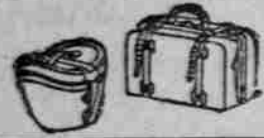

MAKING THE GREAT GATES FOR THE PANAMA CANAL

Pittsburg, Pa., Oct. 31.—The largest gates in the world are being made in Pittsburg for the Panama canal. Any one of the 92 of them, for there are 48 pairs in all, will be about as high as a six-story building, 65 feet wide and seven feet thick. The structural steel that will go to make them will weigh 40,000 tons, or more than eight times as much as was used to build the Eiffel tower.

The weight of a single gate will be about 600 tons, and the dimensions are 77 to 82 feet high, 60 to 65 feet wide, and seven feet thick.
