WOMAN ESCAPES FROM HOSPITAL

Diligent search was started Monday morning for Mrs. Ada Ellis, who, according to the statement of her daughter, was allowed to escape from Providence hospital Monday at an early hour, given as 5:30 to 6:30 o'clock. Also, according to the statement of the woman's daughter, she escaped in her bare feet.
A telephone message to the station early Monday morning informed assistant chief of police Ten Eyck that a woman, scantily clad and in her bare feet, was at 312 Upton avenue. A mounted officer was dispatched to the address but the woman had disappeared. A search was made over that and other sections of the city, but so far efforts to locate her have been unavailing.

SICK MAN DIES FROM HEMORRHAGE

The body of F. C. Black, who died Saturday night in a saloon at the corner of North Stanton and Mills street, is being held at the establishment of a local undertaking firm, pending instructions from relatives as to the disposition of the body.
Black was attacked with hemorrhages while walking along Mills street Saturday night and went into a saloon to ask for aid. Too weak from the loss of blood to speak, he died just as he was writing a note telling who to notify of his death. A telegram was sent to a sister residing at Yonkers, N. Y., but no answer has been received.

MISS BURNHAM DIES.

Miss Nettie Burnham, daughter of Parker Burnham, city jailer, died at the home of her sister, Mrs. Charles Logan, 109 Boulevard, at 3 o'clock Saturday night of heart trouble. She was 24 years of age. The funeral was held at the Catholic church Monday morning at 9 o'clock and interment was in Concordia cemetery.
