

Control of Southern California Interurban Goes to the Southern Pacific.

IS REALIZATION OF DREAM OF HARRIMAN

Los Angeles, Cal., Nov. 12.—With the transfer of the entire Pacific Electric railroad system to the Southern Pacific company, which is now being made, the fondest dream of the late E. H. Harriman, the Napoleon of railroad finance, has been realized.

It is a fact not generally known—or cared—that the name turkey is a misnomer. The ocellated bird of which the country sings was originally supposed to have been a native of turkey, but the real truth is that it is a native of Mexico and not at all a turkey. This shows how far faunal naturalists can go wrong, not being able to distinguish between a Mexican and a Turk. The error may have grown out of the resemblance of the late sultan Abdul-Hamid, of Turkey, to a turkey in the matter of snouts.

Turkey hints. As the turkey is the ched-douvre, the piece de resistance, and the no plus ultra of Thanksgiving day, it might not be out of place for a few household hints, viz: To cook a turkey, first build a fire in the stove, and care should be taken that the bird be picked off the head—the turkey. When serving, ask each guest if he is fond of turkey, as it makes conversation.

THE PRICE OF A BIRD. Even the knovery turkey is 30 cents a pound both in New York and El Paso is not filling stomachs. This does not state the price of a turkey this year in dollars and cents. Dressed turkey in El Paso markets is selling at 30 cents per pound, but the joke is that you can't buy a pound of turkey. You must arbitrarily go the limit of the bird, which may be anywhere between three and six pounds, according to the weight of the bird, you understand.
