MAKE GOOD STRIKE IN LIVE OAK AT 100 FEET

Summit Company Begins Development of Gibson Mine in Globe District.

Globe, Ariz., Nov. 18.—Another good strike has been made in the Live Oak mine at the 23 churn drill hole, where ore of good grade was struck 200 feet east of any previous strike since the churn drill operations began. The strike was made at a depth of 100 feet and is now down 150 feet. The Live Oak ore body is now shown to be 1700 feet long. Two extra churn drills have been purchased and the field will be thoroughly prospected.

Summit to Ship Ore.
The rapidly with which the Summit Mining company has conducted development on the Gibson property since it was purchased several months ago, is made evident by the fact that shipments of high grade copper ore are about to begin going to the Old Dominion smelter. The ore which will make up the shipments is almost pure chalcopryite and runs about 31 percent copper. Bins have been constructed at the vertical shaft and a large supply of ore is already on hand, so that shipments can be maintained at a comparatively uniform rate.

The vertical shaft at which sinking was resumed several months ago at a depth of 244 feet has been continued downward to a depth of 625 feet and at the 600 foot mark a level has been established and a crosscut is being driven to open the Pasquale vein.

The Summit Mining company is employing 40 men. Charles Myers is superintendent.

Inspiration Force 200.
In four different parts of the Inspiration mine, development work is being carried on. The Joe Bush, Scorpion and Colorado shafts and the Copper Wonder and Apex claims are the scenes of activity. Nearly 200 men are at work on the property. The Scorpion shaft has been connected with the Joe Bush by a drift 240 feet long. This was made by driving a drift from the Scorpion shaft 800 feet southward and a second drift from the Joe Bush 1600 feet westward to meet it. A second drift westward from the connection of these two shafts will connect the Colorado shaft with them.

The Colorado shaft is 465 feet deep. Two churn drills are at work on the Copper Wonder and Apex claims toward the top of the hill. The total length of the ore body, from present indications, is 3800 feet. The width varies from 300 to 1200 feet and the average copper content is about 2 percent.

The experimental mill west of the Joe Bush shaft is in operation. Its capacity is 75 tons every 24 hours.

The company is building a new machine shop near the portal of the main extraction and about 2500 feet southwest of the Joe Bush shaft.

Are Getting Results.
The Arizona-Colorado, Copper Belt and gold mining & milling company continue to get interesting results in development.

On the 800 foot level, where the stope has recently been put up, the vein is apparently widening and at the present rate of increase should prove to be a valuable deposit. The ore taken out daily is placed in the stope pile in readiness for shipment to the smelter. It is estimated that between 150 and 200 tons of ore are now lying in the dump. The first shipment, made for the purpose of determining the commercial value of the mine's product, will probably consist of 100 tons. Further concentrating tests are being made of the ore each week.

A development which may be fraught with great import to the future of the property is now under way on the 200 foot level of the mine, where a crosscut is being driven to open the vein at that depth. This crosscut is already over 25 feet long and is expected to break later on a bearing vein within six or six feet of its present face, as it is estimated that the top of the vein should bring it within 30 feet of the shaft which passed through the lode in sinking at the 165 foot mark.

No Water for ore.
Owing to a lack of water the mill of the Lost Gulch United Mines company has not been running for several months. There are between 400 and 500 tons of ore on the dumps. The old averages about \$23 per ton. It is expected that mill work will be resumed shortly, as there are indications of good ore on the northern part of the property.

Is Down 618 Feet.
The sinking of the vein below the 500 foot level of the Telfair shaft at the Arizona-Michigan property is progressing steadily and a depth of 118 feet has already been attained, thus making the total distance from the surface to which exploration has been carried 618 feet. The formation in the bottom of the winze has not changed materially during the past week. Considerable iron is in evidence, but no traces of copper worthy of mention have been disclosed since the sinking has not yet been carried to sufficient depth to reach the ground water level, where it is expected that ore will first be found.

The crosscut driven through the Old Dominion vein from the 195 foot mark in the winze has been discontinued and a measurement just taken shows it to be 59 feet long. This crosscut leads almost due northeast from the winze. Except for a little carbonate stain, no copper was found.

The drift which was driven on the Old Dominion vein from the point in the crosscut on the 300 foot level, by which the vein was first cut, measures 161 feet. Drilling has been discontinued for the present and the sinking of the winze is being hastened.

Planning Cactus Work.
Superintendent T. W. Hamilton, of the Cactus Copper company and Summit Mining company, is in Globe and it is probable that while he is here he will outline plans for the future development of his properties. One of the Cactus camp, located 17 miles west of Globe, prospecting with churn drills has been discontinued temporarily and apparently the company has not yet fully decided what form of development will be inaugurated to further reveal the formation and possibilities of the claims which it holds. Within the last few days one of the holes being drilled in the bed of Pinto creek, southwest of the Hamilton shaft, caved and made continuance of the hole almost impossible, so that for the present and until definite plans are formulated for the future, the management stopped the drill.

TWIN PEAKS BUYS AN OLD SMELTER

Purchases a Plant at Lordsburg and Will Move It.

Superintendent W. C. Marshall, of the Twin Peaks mining company, northeast of Duncan, eight miles from Steeple Rock, Arizona, who was in El

Paso for the purpose of figuring on purchasing machinery, had some assays made of samples from the veins which he said eclipsed the ores of Cripple Creek. A two foot streak of black oxide of manganese assayed \$234.40 gold and \$25.14 silver, making a total of \$259.54.

Another average sample of two feet of red iron oxide assayed \$4.50 gold and \$15.68 silver, making a total of \$67.28.

Along side of the oxide iron streak

a streak 18 inches wide assayed \$29.50 gold and \$17.88 silver, a total of \$47.48. A mineral streak near the center of the shaft averaged \$40 in gold.

Superintendent Marshall on returning to camp negotiated for the purchase of the old concentrator of the Lena Mining company at Lordsburg, N. M., which was built several years ago by Prof. J. C. Carrera. Daniel Fraser, president of the Twin Peaks company, has just arranged for the

It is announced that the present corporation will be dissolved and a new company formed. This company is a gold-silver proposition, whose holdings are located in Sonora, Mexico.

The examination of the Santa Rosalia property was completed by R. De Sallier, who came here from Duluth, Minn., and his report has been forwarded to the company's principal office in Watertown, N. Y.
