

WEST COAST QUIET BUT APPREHENSIVE.

Gen. Thomas Is Ordered to Hold Troops Ready for Border Duty.

Tucson, Ariz., Nov. 24.—The west coast of Mexico states are quiet, though Guaymas officials have issued orders instructing the police to keep a close watch on all public gatherings and prevent the congregation of suspicious characters in groceries and other places where trouble might possibly be fomented, according to passengers arriving here.

Rurales are still stationed along the border near Nogales, S. M. Brig. Gen. Thomas, commanding the department of Colorado, has received orders from Washington to hold the Arizona and New Mexico troops under his command in readiness to be marched to the border to preserve neutrality, according to word received here from Whipple Barracks.
