SPORTING BRIEFS.

HOPPE MAKES NEW RECORD IN THE BILLIARD WORLD.
New York, N. Y., Dec. 2.—Willie Hoppe, of this city, who holds the world's championship at 18.1 and 18.2 ball's record average of 33.5-15 in the first half of his 1000 point match at 18.1 ball line with George Slosson, the former champion, who is the challenger.
In making the record average, Hoppe ran off the first block of 500 points in 15 innings. The former record average was 31, made several years ago by the late Frank C. Ives, who died in Mexico in 1899.
Slosson made 207 points in 14 innings and showed only flashes of his former brilliancy in two of his trials at the table.


AUTUMN ROSE A WINNER.

PULLMAN RATE CUT \$1
CHICAGO TO SAN FRANCISCO
Chicago, Ill., Dec. 2.—The Pullman company's reduction schedule includes a cut of \$1 from Chicago to San Francisco on lowers, making the price \$13. The present rate from Chicago to San Francisco is \$14.
The Great Northern railroad, which owns its own sleeping cars, protested against the proposed reduction. The Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul, which also owns its own sleepers, made no comment on the proposal.
If the Pullman company's offer of a 20 percent reduction in the rates on upper berths in sleeping cars, together with certain other reductions in both uppers and lowers, is acceptable to the interstate commerce commission, the railroads and states appearing in the complaint against the Pullman company will also accept it, according to commissioner Lane.
