BUY BIG TRACT OF UPPER VALLEY LAND

Two Thousand Acres in the Santa Teresa Grant Bring \$100,000.

L. M. Crawford, of the Crawford & Rich company, and P. H. and H. H. Bailey have bought a tract of land in the upper valley amounting to 2000 acres from Austin & Marr. The price paid was \$100,000 and the entire tract, which is located in the Santa Teresa grant up the valley will be put in intensive cultivation at once.

Mr. Crawford left Friday for his home in Topeka, Kans., to arrange for financing the proposition and says he will spend \$50,000 in addition to the purchase price in improving the property.

H. H. Bailey will have the active management of the tract and will arrange for planting a large acreage to grain and orchards. Truck and dairy farming will also be carried on in the tract and the nursery will be sufficiently large to supply the valley ranchers with their trees.

SECOND BIG TRADE WEEK STARTS MONDAY

Crowds of Out of Town Christmas Buyers Expected by Merchants.

Starting Monday, the second trade excursion week will be held under the auspices of the Retail Merchants League. Rebates will be given on all tickets to El Paso when purchases are made in the stores belonging to the league. The same rebate card system will be used as was used for the first excursion, which was such a success.

RECEIVERSHIP FOR RICHARDS APPROVED

Although A. H. Richards, president of the Richards Jewelry company, asks for the appointment of a receiver for the company, the defendants named in the case, including the jewelry company, Joshua Reynolds and Miss D. M. Wilson, oppose the application on the ground that the company is solvent. The hearing of the petition in the case was commenced in the 44th district court Saturday morning before Judge Harper.

The defendants allege that the jewelry company stock will invoice \$30,000 and that the company owes only about \$6000. The plaintiff's petition recites that the stock is valued at \$40,000 and that the First National bank, which holds the Richards' note for \$23,000, cannot control the jewelry company, as both are corporations.
