

SUIT MUST WAIT ON CHAMIZAL DECISION

Action Deferred in Case of White Against Street Railway Company.
Pending a decision by treaty commissioners as to the international boundary between the United States and Mexico relative to Chamizal territory in El Paso section will be deferred in the 41st district court in the alleged personal injury suit of Charles A. White, a carpenter, against the El Paso street railway company.

WILSON IN HURRY TO GET TO PRISON.
Pleading guilty and asking that justice E. B. McClintock sentence him so he could begin serving time in the penitentiary, was the unusual request late Monday afternoon of Fred Hanna, alias T. H. Wilson, who was arraigned on a charge of theft from the person. C. T. Cook, of the Comet rooming house, South El Paso street, was the prosecuting witness. He alleged that Hanna had taken a watch from his clothes while he was sleeping. Hanna was bound over to the grand jury and his bond fixed at \$500, which he was unable to give.

Hanna's statement to justice McClintock, alleged over-the-ribs, testified was responsible for his predicament.

Judge J. M. Walthall, presiding, said \$24.85 had been awarded by justice McClintock in the case of T. H. Wilson vs. S. H. Krome. Krome alleged the suit was based on a gambling any witness could produce.

NOT GUILTY VERDICT IN CINICEROS CASE

On an instructed verdict, Miguel Ciniceros, charged with the murder of Augustin Vallegran, was declared not guilty by a jury in the 24th district court Monday afternoon.

The death of Vallegran occurred last February following a quarrel with Ciniceros, who pleaded self defense. The trial lasted but four hours.

FULTON DIES FROM SHOT BY A NEGRO

Tom Fulton, the young man who was shot by a negro tramp at Yeleta, died at the county hospital Tuesday morning at 6:45 a. m.

Young Fulton while on a tramp to the home of his relatives in Dripping Springs, Tex., was held up by a negro named Yeleta and upon his refusal to give up what money he had, the negro shot him in the hip, the bullet ranging upward and puncturing the intestines. Fulton was brought to El Paso and placed in the county hospital.

Dr. Cook As He Looks Today



NEW YORK, Dec. 26 - In the first installment of his own story, which is to appear in the forthcoming January Hampton's Magazine, Dr. Frederick A. Cook frankly confesses, as promised in recent news dispatches, to uncertainty regarding his claim to the discovery of the pole. Dr. Cook describes the process of conviction of final attainment which grew upon him.

"Accused of being the most colossal liar of history, sometimes I feel that more lies have been told about me than about anyone ever born," says he.

After detailing the supplies taken on his trip, Dr. Cook says: "Were out supplies sufficient to take us to the pole? Much criticism has been expressed concerning the meagerness of food. I can say only that, in the final analysis, this supply barely allowed us to keep alive. I doubt if any men ever suffered from hunger so intensely as we did at Hvald."

of his story occurs this remarkable statement: "My conviction that I reached the pole never was based solely upon observations, figures, or mathematical calculations. I did take these, of course. These figures did not serve to convince me of my achievement. They only corroborated my inner conviction of progress. They were important in working a plan of action over a trackless waste; but as a proof of the conquest they must always be insufficient."

"That I did travel upward of 2500 miles, in some direction, even my enemies credit. Some have described my journey as being in a semicircle, others admit my going pretty far north. Whether I went directly north or was diverted at times, cannot, change the facts of my experience. Wherever I went, however, I did maintain it was northward, and I did reach a spot which I believed to be the pole."

One of the extraordinary features in Dr. Cook's confession is his admission that his conviction of attaining the North pole was based largely upon his observation of his shadow. This theory he presents with great detail.
