START FUND FOR STARVING INDIANS

Pima Tribe in Sore Straights and Bisbee Women to Help Them.

Bisbee, Ariz., Dec. 21.—A public subscription has been started here under the auspices of the Y. W. C. A., to raise funds to help the Pima Indians, who are reported to be starving. The Indians experienced a hard season last summer and they have not sufficient food for the winter. Several organizations in the territory have made plans for immediate succor and it is feared the Indians will die of starvation unless help is given at once.

A fire, believed to be of incendiary origin, seriously damaged the Olson residence in Opera drive. The women of that section of Bisbee helped the firemen to extinguish the blaze, all men being at work in the mines.

Bisbeeites are disappointed over the failure of ex-president Roosevelt to visit this city. The colonel has written to manager Greenway of the Calumet & Arizona that it will be impossible for him to visit this district on his western tour next spring, he having made arrangements to visit Phoenix, Albuquerque and El Paso.

Word has been received that Leslie Roper, who was until recently employed as bookkeeper for the First National bank here, had died in Ventura, Cal.

Reyes Ravel had his right hand badly crushed while trying to leave town on the ore train.

County treasurer Hicks states that this year's delinquent tax list for Cochise county is larger than for any previous year.

The new officers of the local lodge of Owls were installed in the presence of 200 members. The ceremony was followed by a banquet.

FARMERS IN NEED TO GET FREE SEED

Santa Fe, N. M., Dec. 21.—Captain Fred Fornoff of the territorial mounted police, after attending a mass meeting at Estancia, has reported to governor Mills that he had made a thorough investigation of the reports of starvation in the Estancia valley and found no im-

mediate destitution, although two or three hundred families are in the direst poverty and will need free seed to enable them to put in crops next spring. The mass meeting adopted a memorial to delegate to congress W. H. Andrews and secretary of agriculture Wilson asking that these families be supplied with free seed by the government.
