RICH SILVER ORE IN ORGAN DISTRICT

Prospectors From Nearby Towns Hurry to Scene of Discovery.

Las Cruces, N. M., Dec. 24.—Prospectors in the Organ mining district of this county have discovered a vein of ore which assays from 500 to 800 ounces of silver to the ton. The find is being kept as quiet as possible until a company can be organized and the claims staked, but it is said to be a bonanza find.

News of the find has leaked out and a number of prospectors have gone to the Organ district in the hopes of locating the rich ore bearing strata. This in connection with the recent find of nickel vanadium ore, will give the Organ district quite a boost, and with the opening of the Stephenson-Behmet mines the first of the year it is thought that the camp at Organ will begin to boom.

IS FINED IN TWO COURTS SAME DAY

Fined \$25 and costs, amounting to \$31, in county court late Friday afternoon on a charge of theft, following a fine of \$50 in police court Friday morning on a charge of vagrancy, was what happened to Nicaner Zaragoza, who Thursday night at the union station ticket window belonging to Jose Herrera, but finally was said to have attempted to take \$30 secured only \$5. The two fines more than depleted Zaragoza's supply of American currency, as he had only \$94.10 when arrested. He had, however, sufficient Mexican currency to pay the balance of the fine.

Following the \$50 fine in police court, Zaragoza was transferred to the jurisdiction of justice H. F. Staez, who bound the man over to county court. Judge Elyar arranged to consider the case at once and the two witnesses in the case, Jose and Jesus Herrera, left Friday night for their home in Mexico. Zaragoza entered a plea of guilty to the charge of theft in county court.

Joe Hill, charged with aggravated assault, pleaded guilty in county court Friday and was fined \$5 and costs.

MISTLETOE SEASON ENDS; 10,000 POUNDS SHIPPED

Las Cruces, N. M., Dec. 24.—The bulk of the mistletoe shipments have been sent out from this town and now only small local shipments are being made, most of these going to El Paso, Albuquerque and the nearer Arizona, Colorado and New Mexico points.

Altogether there have been more than 10,000 pounds shipped from here this season and the industry is in its infancy. Next year the dealers expect to double this quantity, as the Mesilla valley mistletoe is of high quality, very green and with an abundance of berries.
