NEW TRIAL DENIED TO DALLAS BANKER After Five Days in Jail, Fleming Makes \$10,000 Bond—To Appeal.

Dallas, Tex., Dec. 28.—District Judge R. B. Seay this afternoon overruled the motion for a new trial in the case of Fred Fleming, convicted and sentenced to serve four years for receiving deposits when his bank, the western Bank and Trust company, failed.

The motion was overruled without the attorneys for the state offering an argument. Judge Seay also pronounced sentence. The defense gave notice of an appeal to the court of criminal appeals and Judge Seay set the appeal bond at \$10,000 which was given and Fleming was released. He spent five days in the Dallas county jail.

SOLD VOTE THREE DIFFERENT TIMES

Man Pleads Guilty and Is Fined—998 Indictments For Same Offence.

West Union, O., Dec. 29.—A farmer in Jacksonville precinct came in yesterday and surprised the grand jury by his confession that he was bought three times last election day. For his promise to vote the straight Republican ticket, he said he received \$12.50; on a contract to vote the straight Democratic ticket he was paid \$10 and the price for agreeing to vote for a certain Democratic candidate was \$2.

He pleaded guilty when arraigned and was disfranchised for five years and fined \$5 and costs and given six months in the workhouse with the prison sentence suspended.

One hundred and six indictments were returned yesterday, which brings the total up to 998. There are indications that the number will reach 1500 as predicted by William B. Stephenson, special prosecutor.

Investigation of wholesale vote buying is to be continued through the special grand jury indefinitely in the state, made from the bench today by Judge Blair, whose vigorous action has brought out the facts in a countrywide scandal.

Judge Blair said he would call before him the workers of both parties and "floaters" and added: "We are going to clean up Adams county as it has not been purged since the civil war."

MAN AND WOMAN STRUGGLE FOR BABY Mexican at Fabens Ties a Rope Around Baby in Mother's Arms.

W. W. Owens, who returned Thursday from Fabens, where he has been putting up a wind mill and sinking a well on the school house grounds, took part in an exciting chase after an all-alleged kidnaper Wednesday.

Mr. Owens says he was up on the wind mill and saw a Mexican man and woman struggling in an adobe house nearby. Calling to some men nearby Owens went to the house and says he found Candelario Buzio, a Juarez Mexican, trying to wrench a three-year-old baby from a woman. The man had a larrikin around the baby and was pulling on it with the woman holding the baby and struggling to retain it.

When the Americans approached, Mr. Owens says the Mexican jumped on his horse and fled. A posse of Americans followed, but the man escaped across the line into Mexico. The woman, Buzio's divorced wife and the baby he is said to have been trying to kidnap was his own.

ULLMAN ARRIVES TO SEE HOTEL SITES

New York Man Declines to Discuss Hotel Proposition Until He Sees.

W. A. Ullman, attorney and treasurer of the Andrews hotel syndicate of New York, has arrived in El Paso to make arrangements for the erection of a hotel in this city. No definite steps will be taken for two or three days and in the meantime, Mr. Ullman declines to express any opinion relative to the building of a hotel here.

Several choice sites have been optioned on El Paso street and in that vicinity for the new hotel. Mr. Ullman and associates have had tentative plans prepared and are said to be ready to join the El Pasosans in the erection of a first class hotel, but El Pasosans must show enough interest in the matter to invest their money.

El Pasosans have had the matter under way for many months and many are already pledged to take large amounts in stock in the new enterprise. A first class hotel, to accommodate the most exacting demands of the tourists, is what is proposed.

NEW REPUBLIC OF PORTUGAL TOTTERS

Army and Navy Is Believed to Be Disloyal to New Government.

Paris, Dec. 29.—Advices from Lisbon described the political situation in the new republic of Portugal as threatening. The government is reported not sure of the army and navy.

There is much insubordination in the army, while, as a measure of precaution, three cruisers have been ordered to leave the harbor of Lisbon on various pretexts.

The populace is becoming alarmed. A published report is that the government has discovered a secret society which is plotting to restore King Manuel to the throne and that the leaders of the conspiracy were arrested.

STRING OF BANKS ARE IN TROUBLE

New York N. Y., Dec. 29.—Following the closing Tuesday of the Northern Bank of New York, and its nine branches, the state banking department today assumed temporary charge of the Washington Savings Bank, pending an investigation of its condition.

J. G. Robin, whose operations caused the closing of the Northern bank, is president of the savings institution.

It is expected that depositors in the Northern bank will be paid in full, but no definite statement of the bank's condition is expected for a fortnight.

The grand jury this afternoon has returned an indictment against Mr. Robin. The indictment specifically charges him with larceny of \$8000 from the Northern bank.

RHODE ISLAND IS DENSELY POPULATED Leads List of States—Arizona Has Only 1.8 People to Square Mile.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 29.—Rhode Island has 508.5 persons to the square mile, thus, according to the census bureau, leading the list of states in the matter of density of population.

Nevada, with only seven-tenths of a person to the mile, is at the tail end. Wyoming boasts of 1 1/2 persons to the square mile, while Arizona with one and eighth-tenths stands third from the last.

New Mexico and Colorado are among the states with fewer than 10 to the mile. Texas has 14 and eight-tenths.


