



Its financing only a matter of selling the bonds, representatives of the water users can now go to the reclamation service and say, "We are going to lease that power as soon as it is available and develop this valley. If the reclamation service will bear that in mind when ordering its machinery and get alternating current generators, we will agree to take the plant off your hands as soon as the dam is built and there-by save several hundred thousand dollars on the cost of the dam."

It figures out this way—the company which leases the power will need a power plant. If the one the reclamation service has installed is suitable it would be economy all around to buy that, thereby returning a considerable portion of the \$1,000,000 set aside for electrical development to the reclamation service and cutting down the construction charge per acre just that much, perhaps \$4 or \$7 an acre. If the plant put in first is not available for the subsequent scheme of development, then its cost becomes almost a total loss as soon as it has served its purpose. Hence the extreme desirability of being ready to join hands with the reclamation service at the very beginning of the work.

## REIGN OF TERROR AS RESULT OF BANDITS

(Continued From Previous Page.)

place has been strongly garrisoned with national troops while provisions are being made for the trial. The town is so small that there seemed no place for a large court trial, but the long disused monastery has been fitted with iron bars and now serves as a jail, while an old church will be used as a court room. An especially constructed iron cage near the old altar will hold the prisoners during the hours of trial, and the faithful carabinieri will be on the alert to protect them from the populace who are indignant against them, as well as to prevent the prisoners themselves from holding any communication with their friends.

Cucullo was a former Camorrista who had been judged a traitor to the cause, so his death was decreed by the high council of Camorra numbering 37 chiefs. A few days later, his body was found bearing 47 stab wounds by the peculiar knife of the Camorrista. This happened nearly four years ago, and after a perfunctory investigation on the part of the Neapolitan police the matter was dropped. Then a leader in a Socialist party demanded that the government take up the matter again. The carabinieri, a special body of men belonging to the regular army, were assigned to the capture of the men connected with the murder. One of these, Enrico Alfano, escaped to America. He was arrested in New York at a Camorra banquet by Serg. Petroussina, a naturalized Italian policeman. The murder of Petroussina at Palermo a few months later was a Camorra vengeance which attracted the attention of the entire world to the matter. Enrico Alfano was sent back to Italy however, and with his comrades and several other persons implicated will be placed on trial next month.

**Disrupting the Society.**  
The imprisonment of this number of Camorra chiefs has done much to disrupt the society and their conviction will be equivalent to its final disruption. The Socialist element in the Italian government is firm in its efforts to abolish the Camorra absolutely. Thanks to this activity there is every prospect that the trial will be heard at Viterbo, will be a just and honest one. On all sides of the town carabinieri keep strict watch. No Neapolitan will be permitted to enter the village without a special certificate. For the first time in Italian history the jury is under guard and every possible precaution to prevent the prisoners from communicating with their fellow Camorras has been taken.

All the civilized world is interested in this effort of Italy to overthrow its murderous secret society, for every country has suffered through some of its citizens who have at some time come under Camorrist abuse. American tourists have at various times been held up, robbed, and perhaps left gagged and bound while the bandits made good their escape. Robert Wilmark, a New York man, was for six months kept a prisoner while a pair of Camorra bandits came to America and secured \$1500 for his release.

Tucumcari, N. M., Feb. 25.—Bids are being asked for the construction of the new Elks' club house which will be erected about the middle of March. Contractors have until the 11th of the month to offer their bids and must accompany them with a bond. The blue prints were received from the architect this morning. The building will cost about \$15,000, and will be constructed of native stone, pebble dashed, making one of the finest buildings in Tucumcari.

rect current generators. But when the full drop of 120 feet is available the alternating current is the one best

adapted to that fall and to the greatest number of commercial uses. So, unless alternating current generators are installed in the first place, the water users would have half a million dollars worth of machinery on their hands which would not and could not be used in developing the power from the completed dam.

The government long ago realized that it was extremely desirable to lease this water power rather than handle it itself. But the law only allowed a lease of 10 years. Farsighted members of the El Paso Valley Water Users association, together with accomplished electrical engineers, saw tremendous possibilities in the full development of this power, in particular

an interurban line up and down the valley from one end to another, which would use about 2,000 horsepower of this great amount to be developed at the dam. An estimate of the scheme showed the extremely large sum of about \$3,000,000 would be necessary. Consultation with financiers and underwriting companies showed the utter impossibility of financing such a project if only a 10-year lease could be secured.
