Committees Are Enlarged

PRESBYTERY ENDS EL PASO SESSIONS

Next Meeting Will Be Held With Alpine, Texas, Church.

The first session of the west Texas presbytery of the Presbyterian church adjourned Thursday evening to meet in Alpine, Texas, in semi-annual session in September. The closing meeting included a supper in the basement of the First Presbyterian church, followed by informal addresses by Rev. W. B. Bays, of Fort Davis. He told of his experiences in west Texas as a cowboy-preacher for 23 years. Rev. H. C. Baber, of San Antonio, who is to be the new pastor evangelist of the presbytery, also spoke. The visiting preachers who were here as delegates to the presbytery have returned to their homes.

WOMAN ACQUITTED IN FEDERAL COURT

Bernarda Perez, who was indicted by the federal grand jury on a charge of making counterfeit money, was acquitted by the jury in the United States district court, Wednesday afternoon. She was arrested together with Ceiso Perez by the United States officers about five weeks ago and their case was turned over to the federal grand jury which brought indictments against both. Ceiso Perez, who pleaded guilty to the charge Wednesday afternoon, has not been sentenced yet.

HAD 18 INCH PISTOL AND POLICE TOOK HIM TO STATION

Adrian Gutierrez was arrested by the police Wednesday night and a charge of carrying a pistol docketed against him at the police station. He had a large caliber revolver with a barrel about 18 inches long and some of the policemen had even seen a similar weapon. It is of American manufacture and a valuable weapon.
