TO MR. FRANKLIN'S TOP IN EIGHT MINUTES. Aerial Railway Proposed at a Cost of \$400,000—Los Angeles Plans.

From the heart of El Paso to the top of Mount Franklin's second peak, 6729 feet above sea level and eight miles away, in eight minutes!

Sounds like a fairy tale, but it is really a promise made by Eletcher El Felts, a Los Angeles investor—contingent only on the investment of \$400,000 in an aerial railway of his design.

Los Angeles business men are investing nearly \$1,500,000 in a double track line 15 miles long to the Pacific ocean which will take people to the beach from the heart of the city in 10 minutes.

The city of Los Angeles is planning an aerial line to San Pedro harbor, and an aerial line to Pasadena is promised in the near future.

Two hundred miles an hour with perfect safety, gasoline motors of 70 horse power and large roomy cars are in the plan. The elevated stations are reached by escalators or moving stairways.

The cars, 60 feet long, are suspended from a rail composed of a double I beam with rollers having large bearing surfaces and ball bearings and other devices to prevent friction, noise, jar, swinging or rocking.

Mr. Felts has patents in all countries. He says his system costs \$50,000 to \$75,000 per mile to build and equip, while the German system operating in Berlin costs \$45,000 per mile.

Capital Is Ready. The inventor intimates that he is in touch with capital that would gladly build a line from San Jacinto plaza to the top of Mount Franklin if local support is assured.

TYPHUS BROUGHT TO THIS SIDE. Mingling With Soldiers in Juarez Spreads Deadly Disease to El Paso.

Attending physicians say that there are three well developed cases of typhus fever in El Paso at the present time as a direct result of the presence of the disease in the Juarez hospital among federal soldiers.

One case is that of a hospital nurse, who has been employed in the hospitals in Juarez and who contracted the disease there, but came to El Paso. Another is a Mexican man living in an alley on South El Paso street between Sixth and Seventh; the newest case is that of a Mexican washwoman who lived in an alley in the rear of Fourth street, between El Paso and Oregon streets.

The eruptions characteristic of the disease discovered the case. She was given a disinfectant bath, her hair clipped short and she was wrapped in a sheet heavily saturated with disinfecting fluid and taken to the county hospital. The afflicted man is being cared for there also. Both cases are isolated.

The case of the woman is directly traceable to the presence of the disease in Juarez, where attending physicians say she went to Juarez every evening working as a washwoman in El Paso, and caught the disease while on the Mexican side.

Efforts are being made by the health officers to prevent the spread of the disease and no more cases are expected to develop.

WITHDRAWS FROM THE MOTHER CHURCH. Minneapolis Christian Science Church Decided to Be "Reformed" Church.

Minneapolis, Minn., May 23.—A. E. Smith, C. S. D., of the fourth church of Christ, scientist, here today gave the Associated Press a copy of a resolution adopted at a meeting of the church members at which, by a vote of 93 to 7, the members decided to withdraw from the mother church at Boston.

The reasons given in the resolution are that "since the death of Mrs. Eddy, the Christian Science board of directors has absolute authority to control the teaching" and that the board condemned Christian Science as taught by Abbot Smith, who was a personal student of Mrs. Eddy.

The congregation therefore decided itself severed from the mother church and that its articles be amended so as to become a Christian Science reformed church. The statement also announces that similar action was taken by the second church of Christ, scientist, of Duluth, with only one dissenting vote.
