

NEW HOTEL IS TO BE OPENED IN JUNE

Tea Thousand Trout Received for Graham Mountain Streams.

Safford, Ariz., May 27.—Safford's building activities still continue. The new hotel of Charles Freeman has been christened Hotel Clifton, and will be thrown open to the public some time in June.

Improvements are still being made by the Valley Milling company. The new grain warehouses are just about completed at a cost of nearly \$5000. Coal will be used exclusively hereafter to generate power, and the mill canal abandoned.
